

1. The amount of tests conducted and pass rates for Southampton LGV, Lee-on-the-Solent and Southampton (Maybush) for Categories F, G, H, K, Z, Z1 and Z2

No Category F, G, H, K, Z, Z1 or Z2 tests were conducted from Southampton LGV centre. The table below shows the number of tests conducted in the 2010/11 financial year from Lee-on-the Solent and Southampton (Maybush). Please note that due to the small numbers of tests conducted, we have amalgamated Z, Z1 and Z2 tests together for Lee on the Solent and amalgamated F and G tests for Southampton.
