Under the Freedom of Information act, I would like to know with regards to tests taken at Sale Practical test Centre in Greater Manchester:

1) How many driving tests have involved a collision (minor and otherwise) with other vehicles over the last 3 years

2) How many driving tests have involved collisions with other objects (please could you specify which objects they actually hit e.g. bin, tree, cyclist etc) over the last 3 years

Could you also include whether the person taking the tests above passed or failed.

The table below shows the number of collisions recorded as occurring during a practical test during the last three financial years (2008/09, 2009/10 and 2010/11) at the Sale practical test centre and the result of the test. Please note we have been unable to provide the test result for one case as paper records showing the result are no longer held and it cannot be traced through our electronic records.
