

1) The percentage of tests at Perth LGV driving test centre (DTC) that can be booked by approved training bodies (ATBs)

I can confirm that 100% of all large goods vehicle (LGV) tests at Perth LGV DTC can be booked by ATBs.

2) The daily and weekly booking limits for each ATB that book at this centre

I can confirm that the daily booking limit for LGV tests at Perth LGV DTC is 50% of all the available slots. This percentage limit is purely for the opening day. The opening day is the fixed date every week for any given driving test centre to allow ATBs to book but not name LGV driving test slots 10 weeks in advance.

We do not have weekly trainer booking limits for LGV tests at any test centre. Therefore, this information is not held for Perth LGV DTC.

3) What is the procedure that ATBs should follow if they can't get the allocation on the opening day?

4) What is the procedure that DSA follow if they reject an ATB's request on the opening day?

Information in respect to questions three and four is not held in a recorded format. I can confirm, however, that if an ATB doesn't get the allocation of LGV practical test slots on the opening day they should submit a call back request for additional slots.

On receipt of a call back request our deployment team will look to see if any examiner resource can be pulled from any other test centre to accommodate the ATB's requirements. We will also look to offer alternative dates if we can't meet the ATB's request. Our deployment team will respond to each call back request within five working days.
