





I can confirm that parish councils did not receive direct communication from the department concerning the draft code of recommended practice. Neither did they receive the original letter from the Secretary of State in June last year, although this was only ever intended for those 354 principal authorities given policy direction at the time.

However, as policy developed beyond the SoS's letter and a code drafted, it was discovered that we could include parishes and many other authorities due to the Act upon which the code is based - The Local Government, Planning and Land Act 1980 (section 2 and 3). It's at this point we approached the National Association of Local Councils and the Society of Local Council Clerks to raise awareness in possible policy direction, the draft code and future consultation.




Hi,

I work for Wyre Forest District Council and have come across a couple of situations where there is confusion about whether or not to include certain payments in our expenditure over £500 report which I will outline:

- 1) We are involved in a group named 'Wyre Forest Matters' which involves ourselves, the local PCT and also a charitable trust is involved. The charitable trust is responsible for all the spending decisions. Each year the PCT pay a grant to us as they will not pay this money directly to the charitable trust, we then transfer this money to the charitable trust. It is argued that this is strictly not Wyre Forest District Council's income & expenditure as we are only passing on funds to the charitable trust and therefore the transaction should be excluded from the Expenditure over £500 report.
- 2) Where we employ the services of debt collectors we must pay the VAT on any income they collect on our behalf. We register these invoices on our system with the supply amount (debit) with the corresponding VAT, then a second line credit which nets off the supply to zero. This effectively creates a VAT only payment. The Debit and credit lines that net to zero appear on our report. It is argued that as we are only paying the VAT and VAT is not to be included on the report then both the supply lines should be excluded also.

I would very much appreciate any comments and advice you would be able to give on these 2 situations.

### INCREASED TRANSPARENCY IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Thank you for your letter of 27 January to the Secretary of State suggesting that on-line disclosure logs of all Freedom of Information (FOI) requests become mandatory. I am replying as local authority transparency falls within my portfolio of responsibilities.

I agree that such efforts would help to increase transparency and could also help to manage better future requests for information from taxpayers. While it is not a requirement of the FOI Act, the Ministry of Justice (as lead Department for FOI policy) has encouraged public authorities to so voluntarily. This Department publishes online our own disclosure log at <a href="http://www.communities.gov.uk/corporate/foi/disclosure-log/">http://www.communities.gov.uk/corporate/foi/disclosure-log/</a>. There are no plans to make publication mandatory, although the Information Commissioner does recommend it as best practice.

For our part, we are currently consulting on a Code of Practice on Data Transparency and propose that all local authorities should develop an inventory of data that they hold and publish this so that people can easily access the information that they want. I see no reason why FOI disclosure logs should not be included as part of that inventory.

Thank you for your letter of 9 February to the Rt Hon Eric Pickles MP about the publication of Westminster City Council's expenditure over £500. I am responding as this policy falls within my portfolio of responsibilities.

We are very pleased that Westminster, and the overwhelming majority of councils, has responded to our request to publish expenditure details. It is essential if accountability to local residents is to be strengthened.

Now that data is being published a proactive approach is needed on the part of councils to review content and to pursue higher standards of data quality. Guidance produced by the Local Government Group and Local Public Data Panel helpfully recommends common standards on content to help users share and analyse the content. This advice is available at <a href="http://lgtransparency.readandcomment.com/1-introduction-2/">http://lgtransparency.readandcomment.com/1-introduction-2/</a> and <a href="http://data.gov.uk/blog/local-spending-data-guidance">http://data.gov.uk/blog/local-spending-data-guidance</a> and suggests the publication of the amount, supplier, service area and narrative to help explain payments.

The Government is not being prescriptive about how this is done. As you are aware, the Local Government Group has produced some guidance, and I understand they are working on the next version of that guidance following the consultation. The point about standing orders that we clarified with Local Government Group was that the Government expectation to publish contracts over £500 should not lead to new contracts being signed, when previously they were not required by a local authority.

Having read through the Local Government Group's consultation document 'Local Transparency -A Practitioners Guide to Publishing New Contracts and Tenders Data', I have a query that I would appreciate a response to: The requirement is for all tenders over £500 to be published and I note that the definition of a tender specifically excludes request for quotations. I also note that authorities are expected to work within local standing orders. The Contract Regulations in this authority allow for contracts up to £156k to be awarded via a request for quotations procedure, and therefore I would expect that we should only have to publish contracts above this threshold.

The Local Government Group have confirmed that in their view my interpretation is correct but I have been asked for DCLG's view also - please could you let me know?

The expectation has been placed on local authorities through the letter that the Secretary of State sent to Councils in June last year, and the principles underpinning local authority data transparency were set out in a draft Code of Practice for consultation. The consultation closed on 14 March, and responses are currently being considered. As the draft Code was issued for consultation there is a clear expectation that local authorities should comply with it. The Act upon which the Code is based does provide the power, should it be deemed necessary at a later date, to require publication of information specified in the Code by way of regulations, thereby making publication a legislative requirement.
