We regularly survey driving instructors as part of our customer insight programme. Satisfaction surveys have been conducted annually since 1998. In the period 1998 to 2010, those surveys were conducted by external contractors, who were supplied with a sample from those on the approved driving instructor (ADI) register who had consented for their details to be shared for the purposes of research. Since 2011, the surveys have been conducted by us; ADI details have therefore not been sent to external parties.

We also release details of ADIs (who have consented) for commercial use to accredited mailing houses. We only hold this information from 2008.

In the table below, you can find the number of times ADIs' names and addresses have been supplied to any outside organisation:
