

1) For the 10/11 financial year, please could you tell how many driving examiners reported they were physically assaulted by driving test applicants?

In the 2010/11 financial year, four reports were received from driving examiners that had been physically assaulted by driving test candidates.

2) For the 10/11 financial year, please could you tell me how many driving examiners reported they were verbally assaulted by driving test applicants?

In the 2010/11 financial year, 211 reports were received from driving examiners that had been verbally assaulted by driving test candidates.

3) For the 10/11 financial year please could you tell me how many driving examiners reported they were offered a bribe by a driving test applicant?

In the 2010/11 financial year, 12 DSA driving examiners reported that they were offered bribes by driving test candidates.
