

**1) The number of people that took a car practical test at Llanelli in each of the following years 2009, 2010 and 2011 (to 31 October) with an interpreter**

In the table below, you can find the number of people that took a car practical test at Llanelli driving test centre (DTC) in 2009, 2010 and 2011 (to 31 October) with an interpreter.

<b>Calendar year</b>	<b>Number of people that took a car practical test at Llanelli DTC with an interpreter</b>
2009	39
2010	11
2011 (to 31 October)	9

Please note that the above information is based on:

- the interpreter box being marked on the driving test report form
- a candidate's driving licence number; therefore if a candidate changed their licence number and had a car practical test with an interpreter at Llanelli DTC under two different licence numbers, they'd be counted twice
- the number of people in each year; therefore if the same candidate took a car practical test at Llanelli DTC with an interpreter in 2009 and 2010; they'd be counted twice once in each year. If, however, the same candidate took two car practical tests at Llanelli in the same year with an interpreter, they'd be counted once.

**2) The number of people that had a car theory test with a voiceover at Swansea theory test centre with a Llanelli address (SA14, SA15, SA16) in each of the following years 2009, 2010 and 2011 (to 31 October). Also, provide the language in which the voiceover was provided in.**

In the table below, you can find the number of people that had a car theory test with a voiceover at Swansea theory test centre with a Llanelli address. This information is broken down by year and by the language in which the voiceover was provided in.

- the information provided above is based on a candidate's driving licence number; therefore if a candidate changed their licence number and had a car practical test with a voiceover at Swansea theory test centre under two different licence numbers, they'd be counted twice
- the information provided above is based on the number of people in each year; therefore if the same candidate took a car theory test at Swansea theory test centre with voiceover in the same language in 2009 and 2010; they'd be counted twice once in each year. If, however, the same candidate took two car theory tests at Swansea in the same year with a voiceover in the same language, they'd be counted once
- we also provide the car theory test in 10 other languages; no car theory tests were conducted at Llanelli between 2009 and 31 October 2011 in those languages.
