- if an ADI has moved in to the Northamptonshire area and the Pass Plus course was delivered when he/she lived elsewhere, any information on Pass Plus certificates issued during the time will be included in the above table
- if an ADI lived in Northamptonshire and delivered Pass Plus but has since moved out of Northamptonshire, any information on Pass Plus certificates linked to that ADI won't be included in the above table
