





Six Month Offer Official Statistics Publication Date: 9:30am Wednesday 12th October 2011

Summary

This final publication contains official statistics on the Six Month Offer up to and including March 2011. The key statistics are:

From April 2009 up to and including March 2011:

- 45,970 Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) claimants have used the Recruitment Subsidy
- 48,220 JSA claimants have taken up the Self Employment Credit (six month eligibility)
- 11,790 JSA claimants have taken up the Self Employment Credit (three month eligibility)
- 21,810 JSA claimants have taken up a Volunteering placement
- 100,300 JSA claimants have taken up a Work Focused Training placement

Introduction

- 1. This publication contains final statistics on the Six Month Offer (6MO) up to and including March 2011. Figures have been produced using the latest complete data available at the point of publication.
- 2. This is a joint statistical publication between the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) and the Scottish Government.
- 3. Please note that this publication does not include statistics on Work Focused Training for Wales. The support on offer in Wales was different to that in England and Scotland and we were not able to separately identify 6MO Work Focused Training starts in Wales.
- 4. Every effort has been made to ensure that the quality of these statistics is of the highest standard. Any feedback on this publication series is welcomed.

Policy Background

- 5. The Six Month Offer was announced in January 2009 as a support package for Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) claimants reaching six months unemployment. The Six Month Offer was introduced nationally from the 6th April 2009.
- 6. There were four strands to the Six Month Offer: (1) Recruitment Subsidy, (2) Self Employment, (3) Volunteering and (4) Work Focused Training. A more detailed description of each of the strands can be found in **Annex A** of this document.

- 7. In Flexible New Deal Phase 2 areas the New Deal for Young People delivered support similar to the Self Employment and Work Focused Training strand of the Six Month Offer. It was expected that young people used this support where it was available. From January 2010 the New Deal employment subsidy was withdrawn and the Six Month Recruitment Subsidy was available to all claimants, including young people, in Phase 1 and Phase 2 areas.
- 8. From October 2009 elements of the Young Person Guarantee were introduced, including Future Jobs Fund, Routes into Work and Work Focused Training. The Young Person Guarantee applied nationally from 25th January 2010 and could have affected take up of the Six Month Offer by young people.
- 9. From the 22nd February 2010, claimants in receipt of JSA for three or more months became eligible for Self Employment Credit.
- 10. The Recruitment Subsidy was withdrawn from 30th June 2010. Employers had until 30th July in which to submit a claim for any employment starts before the 30th June 2010.
- 11. All remaining elements of the Six Month Offer ceased in March 2011, although continued revisions to training data are still possible up until the end of November 2011. If necessary, revised training tables may be published separately.

Technical Overview

- 12. These statistics are derived from a range of administrative data sources, some of which have not been used to produce official statistics before.
- 13. Therefore please note that figures in previous releases will have been updated in this final release as more complete data has become available.

Recruitment Subsidy:

- 14. The statistics include both the number of self marketed vouchers used and the number of claimants recruited via the bulk billing arrangements.
- 15. The number of self marketed vouchers is based on DWP financial payments data and was reported against the month the payment was invoiced. The data was cleaned to remove erroneous records according to agreed processes.
- 16. The number of claimants recruited through bulk billing is based on administrative records of eligibility checks conducted by Jobcentre Plus. A start was recorded under the month in which they started employment as declared by the employer.
- 17. There were difficulties matching demographic information for self marketed voucher payments made in the North East region. As a result the "unknown" categories were larger than expected. We have taken action to address this issue but changes could not be fully back dated.
- 18. Some residual Recruitment Subsidy starts were present post July 10 because DWP report by the date the payment is invoiced on their financial system which is

not necessarily the employment start date. These starts were grouped together and shown under July 2010.

Self-Employment Credit.

- 19. The statistics count the number of first payments made by the month in which the first payment was invoiced.
- 20. Claimants starting Self Employment Credit under the three to six month eligibility criteria are reported separately in the tables below.
- 21. A small number of residual Self-employment credit starts are present post March 2011 because DWP report by the date the payment is invoiced on their financial system which is not necessarily the employment start date. These starts have been grouped together and are included within the March 2011 totals.

Volunteering:

- 22. The number of volunteering placements was based on the individual claimant level data supplied by the volunteering brokers.
- 23. Demographic breakdowns for the volunteering strand were produced by linking the data with the Labour Market System.
- 24. From October 2010, the Work Together element of Get Britain Working was introduced which could have affected take up of the Six Month Offer Volunteering.
- 25. The availability of Volunteering placements as part of the Six Month Offer ended in November 2010. A small number of residual Volunteering starts were present post November 10. These starts were grouped together and shown under December 2010.
- 26. Volunteering statistics were reported within the April 2011 publication based on the final set of individual level data. Therefore there has been no update to volunteering statistics within this final publication.

Work Focused Training:

- 27. The statistics on starts for Work Focused Training cover England and Scotland only. This publication includes statistics on the number of completions of Work Focused Training for England only. Data on Work Focused Training in England is sourced from training provider returns made through the Individualised Learner Record (ILR) database. The ILR holds data on all government-funded learners studying at a Further Education College or training provider.
- 28. Data on training in Scotland is sourced from Skills Development Scotland (Corporate Training System). This is similar to the ILR in England, in that it is a collection of data from training providers on learners and their learning participation.
- 29. Statistics for earlier months have been updated following the provision of more complete data from training providers. Training providers may submit data on learner starts and completions some time after the actual event occurred. Figures

- shown are based on returns up until the middle of August 2011. This is the final quarterly publication containing these statistics.
- 30. The numbers of Work Focused Training starts for Scotland are included in this publication, but the demographic breakdown of those starts and statistics on the number of completions are not included. This decision has been taken jointly by the Scottish Government and Skills Development Scotland in line with the Code of Practice for Official Statistics in relation to Principle 6: Proportionate Burden. - 31. Training completion statistics are included within this publication. Currently, only data for England is available. Again the demographic breakdown of those completion statistics is not included. This decision has been taken in line with the Code of Practice for Official Statistics in relation to Principle 6: Proportionate Burden.
- 32. Completion figures for Work Focused Training have been revised due to an improvement in the methodology used to match completions to academic years. This has had the effect of slightly reducing the total number of completions shown in previous publications, in particular from July 2010.
- 33. As revisions to training data are still possible up to the end of November 2011, revised statistical training tables may be published separately later this year if necessary. Job Outcomes

34. Recruitment Subsidy and Self Employment Credit starts are by definition employment starts. Job outcomes for the Volunteering and Work Focused Training strands are not available.

Rounding Policy

35. To reduce the risk of inferring the identity of a claimant from these statistics and other statistics, values less than ten, including zeros, are suppressed and marked with a dash. Values above ten are rounded to the nearest ten. Therefore totals may not equal the sum of the individual cells.

Therefore most of the North East records appear under "unknown". 3: Disability status is according to the learners own assessment if a learner has a disability or disabilities. Claimants recording their ethnicity as "prefer not to say" are categorised as unknown

Annex A: Further Details on the Strands

Recruitment Subsidy:

- The recruitment subsidy was a payment to employers for recruiting claimants who
 had been claiming Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) for six months, where the job was
 for at least 16 hours per week and was expected to last at least 26 weeks. It was
 delivered in two ways;
 - Self Marketed Voucher: Individual claimants were given a voucher when they reached six months unemployed to present to employers at interviews. If the employer recruited the claimant, the employer submitted the voucher to DWP and received a £500 payment. If the claimant did not return to claim benefit within 26 weeks the employer received a further £500 payment.
 - Bulk Billing: Involved working directly with employers who recruited in bulk. Under this arrangement the employer received a £1000 subsidy for every six month plus unemployed claimant they recruited.

Self Employment:

- 2. Eligible Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) claimants could receive a Self-Employment Credit (SEC) worth £50 per week for up 16 weeks once they left benefit to help with start-up costs. Jobcentre Plus directed claimants to expert enterprise help from Business Link (England), Business Gateway and Training for Work (Scotland) and Flexible Support for Business (Wales) who provided tailored information, advice and practical support to claimants interested in becoming self-employed or starting a business.
- 3. Eligibility for SEC was not dependent upon the claimants having engaged with the 'expert partner" and all claims had to be submitted within five weeks of their JSA claim ending.
- 4. From 22nd February 2010 the eligibility for the Self Employment support was extended to include claimants with JSA claims over three months.

Volunteering:

5. Claimants with an interest in volunteering to develop their work skills were directed to a broker to find and arrange a suitable volunteering placement.

Work Focused Training

- 6. The Work Focused Training strand of the Six Month Offer was led and funded by the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills in England, the Scottish Government in Scotland and the Welsh Assembly Government in Wales. It offered training to Jobseeker's Allowance claimants who would benefit from significant up-skilling or reskilling in order to re-enter the local job market.
- 7. In England, as part of this package of enhanced support, there were 75,000 new training places on offer to jobseekers who reached the six month point on Jobseeker's Allowance who would benefit from significant up-skilling or re-skilling in order to re-enter the local job market. Training, commissioned by the Skills Funding

Agency and delivered through the Further Education sector, was focused to meet both the individual's work aspirations and employer demand, taking into account the needs of the local job market. Training was at a range of levels, from Skills for Life to level 3 depending on need. Training could be part-time or up to eight weeks full-time provision. It had to be relevant to the local labour market, be a significant uplift in skills, and allow people to progress to a full qualification. Full-time provision was supported by a Training Allowance.

- 8. In Scotland, the training for the Six Month Offer was provided through Training for Work, the national vocational training programme for the unemployed. Training was demand led, aimed at specific job opportunities and could vary in length from a week to a year. Support for those wishing to be self employed was also available through this programme. Training for Work could be accessed by all people seeking work who were unemployed for three months or more. Day one access was available to those who were disadvantaged in the labour market, such as lone parents, or those with disabilities.
- 9. The support offered in Wales was different from both England and Scotland. The training element of the Six Month Offer was delivered by the Welsh Assembly Government's existing Skill Build programme, which continued to offer preemployment training to Jobseeker's Allowance claimants from their first day of unemployment, with additional funding for 2009-10 to meet rising demand. It was not possible to separately identify 6MO Work Focused Training starts joining the Skill Build programme from overall Skill Build starts.
