NATIONAL INTEGRATED OFFENDER MANAGEMENT (IOM) CONFERENCE

On behalf of the IOM National Strategic Board, I can confirm that the conference will take place on the 3rd and 4th July at the National Policing Improvement Agency's conference suite in Ryton-on-Dunsmore, near Coventry.

I would like to thank all of you who registered your interest in attending. The response to this year's event has been overwhelming and given the very large number of requests we received and considered, it has not been possible to allocate places to all those who expressed an interest. I know that many of you will be disappointed. We have now completed the process for registering and we shall not be accepting any further requests for places. Delegates selected for this year's conference have been notified and their places have been confirmed.

The two day conference will include speeches from a number of keynote speakers covering a range of themes that will help to set out the forward vision for IOM. On the first day, delegates will have an opportunity hear contributions from the Home Office, Ministry of Justice, the Association of Police Chief Officers, the Chief Executive Officer of Avon & Somerset Probation Trust, Sheffield Hallam University, the Serious Organised Crime Agency, the Director of the Prison Reform Trust and the Head of Public Protection Partnerships from the National Offender Management Service.

The second day will include an opening address by the Minister for Policing and Criminal Justice, Nick Herbert, MP. This will be followed by a session on IOM and Police and Crime Commissioners led by the Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime for London. There will also be a keynote address by the Deputy Chair of the Local Government Association followed by the Chair of the Youth Justice Board and other speakers from the Voluntary and Community Sector and Offender Health.
