The NHSCB was established in October - 2012. Work continues across the country to establish the new clinical commissioning landscape in the NHS. December marked a significant move forward when, following a rigorous five-month assessment, the first set of clinical commissioning groups (CCGs) were authorised to commission healthcare services for their communities. They are the first of 211 CCGs that will be responsible for up to £65 billion of the £95 billion annual NHS commissioning budget, from 1 April 2013.

Since the content of the revised statutory guidance and the AAF is interdependent, the delay in publishing the former has had a knock-on effect on the production of the latter. The joint DH and NHS CB Safeguarding Children Transition Board, which includes representatives of DfE and key health and local authority partners, is overseeing the continuing development of the AAF. The document to be finalised for publication, by the NHS CB, in January 2013 will build on the NHS CBA's September interim advice and provide as much clarity as is now possible on accountabilities within the NHS itself. This will meet Ministers' original commitment.
