As discussed please find attached the latest estimate for the additional costs incurred by the MPS on G20, which amounts to £3.8m. The main changes since the last figures submitted are in respect of a potential tax and NI liability in respect of the Hotel Accommodations Costs which HMRC consider to be a taxable benefit (we are currently in negotiations with them to get a dispensation on this) and the cost of Radio Package Support for G20 which isn't covered by the Airwave Contract.


G20 LONDON SUMMIT

I would like to pass on warm thanks and appreciation for the outstanding effort of the Metropolitan Police Service in so effectively managing what has been a huge policing and security operation over the past week while continuing to meet London's wider policing needs

My thanks extend to everyone involved across the Metropolitan Police Service. From my visit to Gold Command, I know that Commander Bob Broadhurst, Chief Supt Ian Thomas and the hundred-plus bronze commanders have shown admirable leadership and clarity of purpose in executing the difficult balancing act of facilitating lawful protest and upholding public order, whilst simultaneously maintaining the high levels of security needed to protect those attending the Summit.

I also recognise the difficult job front-line officers have when policing incidents of public disorder and commend the professionalism they have shown. With some aspects of the media inevitably focused on the points of conflict during the Summit, we should not lose sight of the fact that so many thousands of people were able to demonstrate peacefully and safely on our streets during the past week.

POLICING THE G20 SUMMIT

I am writing to express our gratitude in OSCT for the impressive performance of the policing counter terrorism capabilities in the preparation and successful operational delivery of the London Summit.

The G20 summit obviously presented a significant challenge for the police service as a whole, but I would like to underline our appreciation for the professionalism of the specialist capabilities involved in the management of counter terrorism risks at G20-related venues including hotels and airports. The challenges for those involved in VIP protection were unprecedented in recent memory - not least given the reasonably short notice of the event - and deserve particular recognition. I would be grateful if you could also pass on our thanks to those involved from other forces under mutual aid arrangements.

We would be particularly interested in your views on the learning from this event for our work on the 2012 Games, and look forward to discussing this with your colleagues once they have had a well deserved break.

POLICING THE G20 SUMMIT

I felt it was important to send you a letter quickly to express our appreciation and thanks to you for the way in which the policing operation for the G20 summit was conducted.

I am sure the Home Secretary will write to you formally as well, but I wanted to ensure that you knew that the Home Office team fully appreciate the amount of work and preparation that has taken place to ensure that the policing plan and security arrangements worked.

I have seen at first hand the care that was taken over the planning and risk management, and the close cooperation with the FCO and others that was needed. By any measure, the G20 summit presented a significant challenge – both in its complexity, scale and the threat presented by those wishing to clearly committed to creating disorder.

Commander Broadhurst and other police colleagues stepped up to the challenge, and I am sure that you must share our wish to give them credit for the way in which the policing operation was handled.
