### Note to the questionnaire

This questionnaire is designed for all types of migrant (economic migrants, students, family joiners, asylum seekers and refugees). Not all questions will be relevant for all respondents and respondents will be routed appropriately through the questionnaire by the interviewer. Interviewer instructions and routing are not included in this publication, but are available upon request. Please note, specific questions for asylum seekers only are outlined on page 82 onwards.

### **Questionnaire recommendations**

Prior to use in a survey of migrants, the authors recommend that the following questions be re-evaluated following a full pilot of the survey. The reason for reviewing each question is given after each one.

- Q2.5 What in particular made you want to come and live in the UK instead of another country?
  - Open question following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.
- Q2.6 What in particular made you seek refuge in the UK rather than another country?

  Open question following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.
- Q2.12 Why did you not claim asylum straight away?

Open question – following pilot consider whether to create codes, or whether the question should be kept. Some indication in the testing that respondents may not be willing to answer this honestly.

- Q3.3 Why are you applying for UK Citizenship/Permanent Residence
  - Open question following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.
- Q3.6 Why do you say that? (follow up to 3.5 How likely or unlikely are you to apply for UK Citizenship/Permanent Residence?)
  - Open question following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.
- Q3.7 The Government has recently announced its proposals for Earned Citizenship, which will require non-UK citizens to earn the right to apply for UK Citizenship or Permanent Residency. Before today, had you heard about the Earned Citizenship proposals?

  Questions on Earned Citizenship may need to be reassessed in light of any new policy developments.

### **Q3.8** Where did you hear about Earned Citizenship?

Q3.9 To get UK Citizenship/Permanent Residency faster, Earned Citizenship asks you to do voluntary work, for example for a charity or community group. Would you do this if it meant getting UK Citizenship/Permanent Residency faster?

### Q3.10 Why do you say that?

Review whether these questions should be included in the questionnaire. There was little knowledge of Earned Citizenship in testing, although it is a new initiative so this may change. If the decision is made to keep the questions, a code frame could be created for Q3.10.

### Q3.12 Why did you apply for UK Citizenship?

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

# Q4.5 Why do you say that? (follow up to 4.4 On balance, how would you rate your experience of the UK immigration system?)

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

# Q4.8 Why do you say that? (follow up to 4.7 Overall, would you say the service you received from the National Asylum Support Service/NASS was:)

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

#### Q8.5 Which of the following types of benefits (or tax credits) were you claiming?

Review after pilot to establish if participants are answering this question accurately and levels of those answering 'don't know'. Consider whether to keep the question based on this.

#### Q8.12 Why do you send money to friends and family in your home country?

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

### **Q8.22** What is your religion?

Check if any religion not specified is mentioned regularly and may require inserting into the list.

# Q9.7 Have you ever been homeless whilst in the UK? That is not having a fixed address or sleeping on the streets?

This could not be fully tested during cognitive interviewing due to small numbers. Review answers in pilot and make judgement on its future inclusion.

# Q9.8 Looking at this card, which of these options best describes where you would usually stay the night when you were homeless?

This could not be fully tested during cognitive interviewing due to small numbers. Review answers in pilot and make judgement on its future inclusion. Check if options on showcard capture the most common scenarios and whether it causes problems for shift-workers.

### Q9.9 Have you ever received Local Authority homelessness assistance?

This could not be fully tested during cognitive interviewing due to small numbers. Review answers in pilot and make judgement on its future inclusion. Check levels of 'don't knows' to ascertain understanding.

#### Q9.12 Why did you choose to live in Scotland rather than somewhere else in the UK?

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

#### Q9.13 Why do you live here?

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

### Q9.16 Why have you considered moving?

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

### **Q9.17** Why have you not moved already?

Open question – following pilot consider creating codes to form a showcard for respondents to choose from, or a pre-code list for interviewers.

### Q9.18 What would encourage you to stay where you are currently living?
