**Re: S31 Grant Determination Letter for Special Educational Needs (SEN)
Reform Grant (2014-15) [DfE 345/2013]**

This Determination is made between:

- (1) **The Secretary of State for Education** and
- (2) **The local authorities listed at Annex A**

Purpose of the Grant

The purpose of this grant is to provide support to local authorities in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them.

Local authorities can spend this one-off grant to recognise the programmes of change underway in the areas of SEN. They may, however, choose how to spend the money in order to best meet local need.

The Children and Families Bill will transform the lives of children and young people with SEN. It will improve outcomes for children and young people with SEN; increase choice and control for parents; and promote a less adversarial system. Local authorities are undertaking a range of reforms to prepare for these changes.

SEN Reform GRANT DETERMINATION [2014-15]: No 31/2254

The Secretary of State for Education (“the Secretary of State”), in exercise of the powers conferred by section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003, makes the following determination:

Citation

1) This determination may be cited as the SEN Reform Grant Determination [2014-15] [No. 31/2254].

Purpose of the grant

2) The purpose of the grant is to provide support to local authorities in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them.

Determination

3) The Secretary of State determines the authorities to which grant is to be paid and the amount of grant to be paid; these are set out in Annex A.

Treasury consent

4) Before making this determination in relation to local authorities in England, the Secretary of State obtained the consent of the Treasury.

Payment arrangements

5) Grant will be paid in four instalments of as near equal value as possible on, or by, 31 May 2014, 31 August 2014, 30 November 2014 and 28 February 2015.
