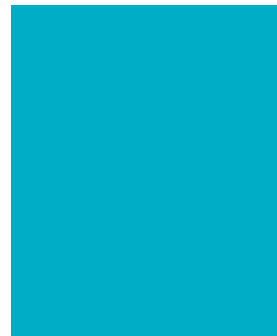
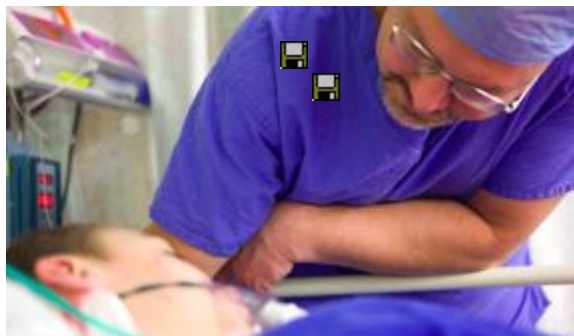

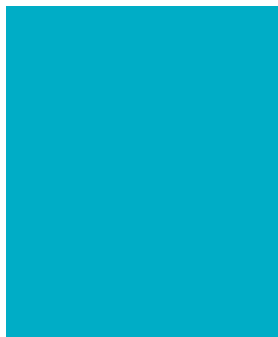

Position Statement

- 100% of CCGs confirmed register in place and being maintained
- 100% confirmed identified a first point of contact for each individual being reviewed
- 1317 CCG funded patients identified for a review
- 1279 reviews completed
- 38 outstanding reviews agreed to be completed end July
- Additional exercise (during July) to ensure that people who challenge in secure services including CAMHS have been captured on registers and have received a review



Outstanding Reviews

In the following 8 CCGs:

- Birmingham South & Central (1)
- Birmingham Cross City (1)
- Croydon (2)
- Newcastle North & East (8)
- Newcastle West (7)
- North Tyneside (8)
- Northumberland (8)
- Gateshead (3)



Next Steps to Assure Quality

Quality assurance programme to ensure:

- Individuals are safe now
- Reviews done properly
- Ex Winterbourne residents are getting the right care and robust plans for transition
- Quality of care for patients with providers about which CQC have identified concerns



Next Steps to Assure Quality (contd.)

Immediate next steps:

- Deep dive regarding former Winterbourne View patients
- Wider sampling exercise to test quality of reviews
- Deep dive review of patients in services about which CQC has concerns



Next Steps to Assure Quality (contd.)

Former Winterbourne View patients:

- Of former 48 patients, 34 people are in social care and 14 people in health settings
- Anonymised data collection from commissioners
- Commitment to transparency
- Risk assessment IG requirement



Next Steps to Assure Quality (contd.)

Specialised services (secure and CAMHS) – additional exercise July to ensure:

- Have been identified
- Details passed to CCG for the register
- Had or identified as needing a review
- Consistent record keeping



Next Steps to Assure Quality (contd.)

Communications:

- H&WBs – letter from the Minister
- Use every opportunity to reinforce model of care and working with local government
- Tools to support work e.g. joint health and social care self-assessment framework
