A panel of clinical experts will advise on the timing of roll-out.</p>
<p>Publish proposals for closer integration as part of the Social Care White Paper</p>	<p>The publication timetable has changed.</p>
<p>Monitor information sharing and evaluate its impact</p>	<p>The Department of Health and Home Office have seen a draft report of the audit and Ministers have agreed to defer publication until there is more comprehensive national coverage. This will make the findings more robust and enable key areas to be targeted so that we can better deliver the Coalition Commitment. We will publish the final report in the autumn.</p>
