## Notes:

The numbers are based on the estimated cost of retail relief that authorities expect to give in 2014-15 (estimated cost divided by £1,000). However, as some properties may receive less than £1,000, if their net rates bill is less than £1,000, the number of properties that receive the relief may be higher.

Some authorities did not provide estimated costs of the relief they expect to give. However, we understand that they do intend to give premises in their areas the retail relief.

Overall, local authorities estimate that they will provide more than £272 million of retail relief in 2014-15. The estimated total number of retail hereditaments expected to receive the relief is at least 272,300.

The cost of relief figure was collected as part of the recent business rates retention scheme forecasting exercise in which all 326 billing authorities took part.
