General Practice Profiles on Cancer

I am writing to bring to your attention a new resource, which we hope, will help drive local improvements in cancer care. It is widely recognised that GPs have very important roles in prevention and early diagnosis of cancer as well as in supporting patients through and after treatment and at the end of life. However, until recently there has been very little information available to enable general practices to benchmark their own activity and performance against that of other practices.

The National Cancer Intelligence Network and the Association of Public Health Observatories have now developed a first edition of GP Practice profiles on cancer. These profiles currently cover (amongst other things):

- Take up of cancer screening (to be added imminently)
- Utilisation of the 2 week wait urgent referral route
- The proportion of patients referred urgently who are subsequently diagnosed with cancer
- Endoscopy procedures
- Emergency presentations of new patients with cancer
- Emergency admissions of all patients with cancer

Over time, we are planning to extend the range of indicators to include, for example, utilisation of other diagnostic tests relevant to cancer.

In this first phase of rollout the profiles will be available through the Cancer Commissioning Toolkit. This is already available to NHS employees and almost all PCTs are now registered. You can register for access to these profiles at https://www.cancertoolkit.co.uk Access is being extended to GPs. In due course, we would envisage information like this being made available to the public.

We would encourage whoever leads on cancer within your organisation to access the profiles. This will enable them to assess variations between GP

practices across your PCT and to compare local performance with that across the country. We also believe that this information will be useful for discussions with individual practices

Alongside the work of individual PCTs, the National Cancer Action Team is working with cancer networks to strengthen primary care engagement on cancer. GP Leads have been funded to visit practices, especially those that are outliers in terms of their profiles, to discuss the profiles with them.

You may wish to speak to your GP Lead about their work and, particularly, about which practices they are working with in your area. A list of the current GP Leads is attached with this letter.

We recognise that we will not have got the profiles right first time, and want to work to improve them over time. We would therefore, be very grateful if you could provide feedback about the practice profiles and the way you have used them.
