## The Honourable Peter Richard CARUANA QC

Politician, Barrister and former Chief Minister, Gibraltar. For services to Gibraltar

Peter Caruana stepped down as Leader of the Opposition in Gibraltar in January 2013 following a long career in public service including election for four terms as Chief Minister totalling 15 years. He has made an immense and outstanding contribution to the reputation and prosperity of Gibraltar having driven the Territory forward politically and economically during his tenure through a period of transformational change with diversification of the economy and significant advances and achievements in political and community life for the benefit of Gibraltar.

## Professor (Arthur) Alan DASHWOOD CBE QC

Barrister, Emeritus Professor, European Law, University of Cambridge and Professor, City University, London. For services to the development of European law

Professor Dashwood is one of the most distinguished and respected lawyers and academics in European law and has made an exceptional and influential contribution to the development of European law over more than 40 years. He has shaped academic thinking on European Union issues and has taught, supervised and inspired generations of undergraduate and post-graduate students in the study and practice of European law.

He has given outstanding service to HMG on the EU Constitution and Balance of Competences review on top of his long service as an expert on and in developing European law including service at the European Court of Justice and Council Legal Service.

He was appointed one of Her Majesty's Counsel in 2010 and continues in active practice as a member of Henderson Chambers.

#### Simon James FRASER CMG

Permanent Under Secretary and Head of the Diplomatic Service, Foreign and Commonwealth Office. For services to the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and the pursuit of British foreign policy interests

Simon Fraser has shown extraordinary leadership in navigating and overseeing the FCO's achievements through an exceptionally challenging period. He mobilised the FCO to deliver an effective UK response to the Libya crisis, as well as handling the strategic implications for the UK of the wider Arab Spring movement and the Fukushima nuclear incident. He has also created and driven forward "Diplomatic Excellence", to deliver improved FCO policy making capability, modernise working practices and management systems and invest in the skills of FCO staff. He has strengthened the network of diplomatic posts which has led to the opening of 19 Embassies and Consulates and many more staff in the emerging powers to build up the FCO's capability to promote British trade and investment whilst reducing the overall running costs of the FCO.

#### David Norman REDDAWAY CMG MBE

HM Ambassador, Turkey. For services to British diplomacy and furthering UK interests in Turkey

During his career David Reddaway has served with distinction as British Ambassador to Turkey and Ireland; as British High Commissioner in Canada; and as Chargé d'Affaires in Iran. His achievements in Turkey have included leading a step change for British business there, a major impact on the growth of the bilateral relationship to secure wider co-operation on foreign policy and security issues and a major achievement in changing visa policy to encourage business links. He also helped to deliver successful substantive reciprocal visits by the two Prime Ministers and a State Visit by President Gül to the United Kingdom in 2011.
