The short answer is Yes... there are implications for the Wales Office site. But it should be OK.

WordPress uses cookies for various things, to do with ease of use mostly; and we're also using third party services like Google Analytics, which rely on cookies.

But to use the terms in the guidance, most would fall into the 'minimally intrusive' category at worst. I can't immediately think of anything I've ever built, which would fall into the 'moderately intrusive' category (or worse).

However... the good news is that you're in exactly the same situation as every other government site using WordPress. So it would be possible for someone to commission a 'plugin' which could be added to all government WordPress sites, to implement a common solution of some sort. (Actually... it's something I think government should be doing, as a service to the many thousands of citizens running WordPress.)

I've had it in my mind for a little while now; I think I'll ask around my Whitehall contacts, or maybe post something on my blog, to see if there's any interest in teaming up.

Often it's information that's actually helpful to you as a user; but theoretically, it could be invasive to your privacy... which is why the EU decided to legislate on the matter. It's a bit of a joke in the industry, to be honest: it'll be nigh-on impossible to enforce meaningfully.

I suspect you're both only interested in how it affects your sites.

- Like most other sites these days, both use Google Analytics to measure site traffic: cookies are fundamental to the process. So, as soon as someone hits any of your pages, Google Analytics leaves several cookies.
- The CDW site uses cookies in connection with its public commenting functions. There is a plugin called Bad Behavior (sic), which uses cookies to detect and filter out comment spam. Additionally, if someone enters their details in the comment form, WordPress saves a few cookies to save them having to type them all in again next time.
- The CDW site also uses cookies in conjunction with its multilingual function: the user's current language preference is stored for future use. (The WO site/s don't work in the same way.)

- WordPress itself uses cookies in the login process. This obviously affects you directly; but since neither site offers public login ability, that shouldn't be a wider concern.
- The CDW site includes a Twitter widget, showing latest tweets: this too drops cookies.
- If you ever embed third-party functions - eg a YouTube video - this will also drop cookies.

The Government Digital Service's guidance (which you forwarded to me) recommends a detailed page of information on how cookies are used; but stops short of recommending the very intrusive 'explicit opt-in' approaches, as seen at the Information Commissioner's Office website (www.ico.gov.uk).

The best thing to do, I think, is to draft a new page on the subject, following the broad model of:

I'll also change the code we use to bring tweets into the CDW site, as there are alternatives which work equally well, but don't use cookies.

Sorry, I'm not going to be able to do much about this today, but let me clear up one point (which I think we've talked through before).

There is no domain swyddfacymru.gov.uk, nor has there ever been.

Your Welsh-language address is swyddfa.cymru.gov.uk - note the addition of an extra dot.

The domain is cymru.gov.uk - owned, rightly, by Cardiff. The 'swyddfa' part is a subdomain. You can't have a separate owner for a subdomain: that just isn't how it works. So we simply can't talk about transferring ownership of that address.

If you wanted a Welsh address to call your own, you'd need to register a new one. But there's an effective moratorium on new .gov.uk addresses, and the benefit of having it would be marginal at best. So I think we can leave it as is.

(To avoid any future confusion: cymru.gov.uk is managed by [REDACTED] within [REDACTED] account. This does *not* mean that the swyddfa.cymru.gov.uk website also needs to sit with [REDACTED])

I hope that clears everything up.

Once Cabinet Office have been able to download the file successfully, they *MUST* notify me immediately, so I can remove the file.

The problem here is that the walesoffice.gov.uk domain - which we've recommended you transfer away from [REDACTED] and which (I believe) is in the process of being transferred to [REDACTED] has now lapsed. The official ownership record says it is due for renewal on 23 June 2012, which explains why the website is no longer available.

I have been in touch several times in the last month or two, to find out what stage we were at, in making this transfer happen, and I've done my best to help explain how it all works. But I have no direct involvement in this, nor do I have contacts at either [REDACTED] or [REDACTED], so I can't therefore do anything directly to assist.

I have tried logging into [REDACTED] to see if the transfer has happened; but I can confirm that it has *not*. The account still shows zero domains being managed through [REDACTED] (I warned about this most recently in an email dated 31 May.)

Domain transfers should take hours, not days or weeks. Given that your contact at MOJ recommended using [REDACTED] he may be able to assist if the transfer has stalled for some reason.

I'm afraid I will be travelling tomorrow (Monday), and will be unable to take calls.

PS If there is any doubt about the domain being the problem... the fact that the Welsh language site, and indeed the [REDACTED] site, are both working fine is proof that the server itself is OK. They all run from within the same software, on the same [REDACTED] server.
