Module D: Requirements

This module is asked of respondents who had not finished their Community Order by the first interview, i.e. respondents who have been on an Order since the first interview.

This module identifies what requirements the respondent has been doing since the previous interview. If a specific requirement has changed, the reason for this change is explored. The module further asks about new activities and identifies requirements the respondent has started since the first interview.

Respondents are asked the first half of the questions depending on the requirements they identified in the baseline interview. The second half of the module is asked of everyone to identify activities started since the baseline interview.

The information from this module results in flags which flag up requirements started at baseline interview and another flag for requirements started following the baseline interview. These flags are used for routing into the requirement modules E to K.
