FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

I refer to your e-mail of 28th October 2011 addressed to ***********. This has been passed on to this office to respond. We have dealt with this request under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You asked for details of testing throughput, income from testing and any other quantitative information relating to the Heavy Goods Vehicle Testing Station (HGVTS) in Shrewsbury operated by the Vehicle and Operator Services Agency (VOSA). This information for 2009, 2010 and 2011 (to the end of September) is contained within the spreadsheet attached to the covering e-mail.

Testing fees for statutory testing carried out on heavy goods and passenger service vehicles are laid down in legislation and the amount payable is based on axles, rather than tests.
