## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

I refer to your email of the 5<sup>th</sup> December 2012. We have dealt with this request under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You have asked:-

- A) how many inspections of school buses have been carried out by the Vehicle and Operator Services Agency in each year since 2003.
- B) how many random spot checks on school buses have been carried out by the Vehicle & operator Services Agency in each year since 2003 and how many buses failed.

I believe you spoke to my manager who explained Operation Coachman, which targets buses and coaches transporting children to and from school. The operation is organised by Dorset Police, involving a nation-wide check.

I have provided a link below to VOSAs effectiveness reports which provides a year on year number of Scottish PSV checks which includes a high element of buses checked which are used for the carriage of school children, these report also include the prohibition rates for PSVs, however this cannot be broken down to school buses <a href="http://www.dft.gov.uk/vosa/publications/corporatereports/corporatereports.htm">http://www.dft.gov.uk/vosa/publications/corporatereports/corporatereports.htm</a>

May I offer the following information, which gives an overview of the work being carried out in Scotland with regards to School bus safety.

There has been no work carried out under the banner of "Operation Coachman" for some considerable time, however Police forces throughout the country do carry out checks of buses, minibuses and private hire vehicles used to transport children to from school and on excursions during school time to ensure that they comply with the current safety requirements. This work is generally carried out with the assistance of the Vehicle and Operator Services Agency (VOSA) and in conjunction with local authorities.
