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## Percentage of schools providing access to extended services as at June 2010

### INTRODUCTION

This publication reports on the percentage of schools<sup>1</sup> offering access to extended services per local authority as of 10<sup>th</sup> June 2010. Data is given for the total number of schools providing access to the full core offer of extended services as a percentage of the total number of schools in the local authority.

### KEY POINTS

- As at 10 June 2010 the total number of schools offering access to the full core offer of extended services was 21,273.
- As at 10 June 2010 nationally the percentage of schools offering access to extended services was 98 percent.
- The percentage of schools offering access to extended services by local authorities ranged from 89 percent to 100 percent.

### TECHNICAL NOTES

- The full core offer is made up of five elements:
  - A varied range of before and after school activities including study support in a safe place to be for primary and secondary schools;
  - Access to Childcare, 48 weeks a year for primary schools;
  - Parenting and family support;
  - Swift and easy access to specialist health and social care services;
  - Community use of facilities including adult & family learning and information, communication and technology.
- Provision is in response to local demand and determined by user consultation, but it can be delivered through clusters where schools work in partnership to

provide access to services. Schools are not expected to provide services alone, or necessarily to deliver them on site. Instead, they should be working in partnership with local authorities, other schools (in clusters) and local partners including private and voluntary sector, Primary Care Trusts, health and social care services and community organisations and, where appropriate, signposting to existing services.

- To ensure the information burden placed on schools is kept to a minimum, most local authorities will structure their information gathering around existing school visits and interactions. This means typically information on each school is updated two to three times over the course of the year and this information is sent to the Department's implementation partner the Training and Development Agency.
- The Training and Development Agency online system is pre-populated with the names, addresses and reference numbers for all of the schools within each local authority. Against each school there are a series of indicators and drop down boxes from which local authorities can populate information on a schools progress in providing access to extended services.
