DH Freedom of Information Request

We have received a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act regarding the meeting we had on 30 January 2013. The request asks for:

- 1. all notes taken by officials
- 2. the name and title of each individual in attendance
- 3. the date
- 4. the location

For ease of reference I attach the note of the meeting that we earlier agreed. It seems to me that this contains all the information asked for and I can confirm that DH officials no longer hold any further notes from this meeting.

As you know, the FOI Act requires DH to disclose information in response to a request unless an exemption applies. There are two types of exemption in the FOI Act. The first type is an 'absolute' exemption, whereby disclosure may be withheld if the information falls within the terms of the exemption in question. The second type is 'qualified' exemption, whereby information can only be withheld if the balance of the public interest, in all the circumstances of the case, favours maintaining the exemption of the information.

Please let me know if you have any views about the question of disclosure of any information under this request, or matters that you wish us to take into consideration. All relevant factors will be taken into account when deciding whether disclosure of the information identified is required under the FOI Act, in particular where appropriate, the public interest considerations both in favour of and against disclosure.

I would be grateful if you could respond to me (copied to my colleague
by Friday 22 March to enable DH to consider any points you wish to
make and reach a decision within statutory the FOI Act deadline.

If we do not hear from you by this date, we will assume that you are content with the disclosure of the attached note.



I can confirm that no decision about standardised packaging of tobacco has been made by the Government. The position remains the same as when we last spoke during our visit to Imperial Tobacco's factory in Nottingham in March. The evidence that the Minister for Public Health gave to the EU Select Committee that you refer to is the current position.

I can reassure you that the UK did not speak in favour of introducing standardised packaging at the European Council Working Group meeting on 26 March. There is, therefore, no need to issue any retraction or clarification.

I am not sure what report you have seen of this meeting. Perhaps you can tell us more about who prepared the report, and share it with us?

We noted that when you and Anna Soubry the Parliamentary Under Secretary of State with responsibility for public health appeared in front of the House of Lords Select Committee on the European Union Home Affairs, Health and Education (Sub-Committee F) Anna Soubry stated "the consultation having concluded – but until any decision is made it is not for me to give my own views or indeed the views of the Government, other than to say that the Government are entirely neutral and have no policy on standardised packaging."

I am therefore somewhat surprised to read a report of the European Council Working Group meeting on 26th March 2013 which was attended by a UK delegate. I am not sure if that was you or one of your team or a member of the PermRep in Brussels. However it is reported that the UK delegate spoke out in favour of Plain Packaging along with Finland and Slovenia. This seems at odds with what Anna Soubry told the House of Lords Select Committee.

Please could you clarify if a decision has been made or if this statement was made in error and if in error get it formally retracted at the next meeting.

It would be helpful if like in other areas EU draft Regulations are being discussed it is common for UK departments to share reports of the meetings with all stakeholders. Thank you for your e-mail of 16 April.

I am disappointed that you have not felt able to confirm the source of the information you are receiving about the proceedings of the Council Working Group on the Tobacco Products Directive. This is a pity because, as I made clear in my earlier email, I would willingly make informal contact to make sure there is no misunderstanding about the UK position on tobacco packaging, or on any other tobacco control topic covered by the proposed TPD.

On the question of appropriate procedures, I would like to clarify another point that you made in your original e-mail of 9 April, that you believe that "...it is common for the UK departments to share reports of the [working group] meetings with all stakeholders." I am surprised to hear this because Council working groups are not held in public and deliberations are subject to principles of professional secrecy (as set out in the Council rules of procedure, Articles 5 and 6). I am again concerned to hear about UK negotiating positions taken at the Council Working Group on 8th April on the EUTPD when the Consultation on Standardised Packaging for tobacco products has not yet reported and as you recently (11th April which is subsequent to this working group)said "no decision about standardised packaging of tobacco has been made by the Government".

We heard that at the working group meeting UK along with FRA,BEL,HUN,BG,FIN,SLK and SLV supported Article 13.1 about standardisation of packs — "A unit pack of cigarettes shall include at least 20 cigarettes. A unit pack of roll-your-own tobacco shall contain tobacco weighing at least 40g." - you said the UK Government does not have an agreed position on Standardised packaging for tobacco products so this support seems inappropriate at this time. We have submitted to you packs of 10 cigarettes have a significant market share in the UK and we are told by many smokers they use it as a means of controlling their level of smoking. Buying one pack a day limits them to a maximum of 10 whereas if they buy a pack of 20 they are not able to control their consumption as easily. The roll-your-own minimum 40g will drive many smokers to source their tobacco from the illicit market. Most of the roll-you-own in the UK that is sold with UK duty paid is in 12.5g and 25g packs owing to the price point as a result of the UK duty level. The pouch swap survey carried out to monitor the level of illicit trade in the UK shows a huge proportion of the 50g packs are non-UK duty paid. 50g packs represent less than a quarter of the UK legal market.

We also heard that UK supported, along with FRA,BEL,SLV,FIN,MLT and LUX, Article 12 "cigarettes with a diameter of less than 7.5 mm shall be deemed to be misleading" which is surprising as there was no evidence of this presented as part of the consultation and as the consultation has not been finalised and agreed by Ministers so as you said the UK Government does not have a position on this. Please can you send us a copy of the scientific evidence you have to support this position as policies are supposed to be supported by robust data.

We are encouraged to hear that UK wanted to consult with "Customs colleagues" over Article 14.

We have not spoken with officials of the European Commission on this. You are right in that the term "customers" is not separately defined under "Interpretation" in regulation 2 but reg.5(2)(c) refers to "customers who wish to buy products other than tobacco products and smoking accessories". The regulation therefore covers anyone who is considering the purchase of a non-tobacco related product being offered for sale in that retail outlet. As you know, displays to members of the tobacco retail trade are covered by section 7B(1) of TAPA and are not prohibited provided that they meet the conditions in that section, ie they are acting for the purposes of that trade.

I hope this provides the confirmation you need.

I have been given your details by regarding this; I do hope you can be of assistance.

My query relates to the Regulations that apply to "bulk tobacconists" as described in SI 445. I have received a number of calls from our trade customers, all seeking definitive clarification as to what is expected of them should the Regulations come into force. I have a good understanding of these Regulations but it would make much more sense to provide government-approved guidance to our trade customers, rather than merely providing our interpretation of them, as I'm sure you will agree.

As the Regulations stand, bulk tobacconists (who meet the 90% criteria based on sales data) must ensure that the tobacco room is not visible from outside the area, and should also display the relevant notice at the entrance to the tobacco room. Bulk tobacconists should also ensure that customers who wish to buy other products are not encouraged to pass through the tobacco area. This is quite explicit and straightforward.

As far as I can determine, however, there doesn't seem to be any definition of who the 'customer' is, although the interpretation is that this means members of the general public as opposed to members of the retail trade ('trade customers'). Can you clarify this please?

Sincere apologies if I have missed the obvious here, but I want to ensure that I provide our trade customers with as much accurate information as possible.





I have been given your details by regarding this; I do hope you can be of assistance.

My query relates to the Regulations that apply to "bulk tobacconists" as described in SI 445. I have received a number of calls from our trade customers, all seeking definitive clarification as to what is expected of

them should the Regulations come into force. I have a good understanding of

these Regulations but it would make much more sense to provide government-approved guidance to our trade customers, rather than merely providing our interpretation of them, as I'm sure you will agree.

As the Regulations stand, bulk tobacconists (who meet the 90% criteria based on sales data) must ensure that the tobacco room is not visible from

outside the area, and should also display the relevant notice at the entrance to the tobacco room. Bulk tobacconists should also ensure that customers who wish to buy other products are not encouraged to pass through

the tobacco area. This is quite explicit and straightforward.

As far as I can determine, however, there doesn't seem to be any definition

of who the 'customer' is, although the interpretation is that this means members of the general public as opposed to members of the retail trade ('trade customers'). Can you clarify this please?

Sincere apologies if I have missed the obvious here, but I want to ensure

that I provide our trade customers with as much accurate information as possible.
