1 Executive Summary

- 1.1 It is of paramount importance that children are protected when they're at school and there are robust safeguards in place when a teacher is employed. The proposed changes to the advice provide clarification on the teacher prohibition process and procedures and provide clearer advice on the Department's expectations when panels are considering evidence to support a recommendation to prohibit a teacher from teaching. This consultation invites comments on the revisions proposed. The changes apply to England only
- 1.2 This consultation seeks the public's views on proposals to revise the 'National College for Teaching and Leadership (NCTL) Teacher misconduct the prohibition of teachers advice. This advice provides clarification to all those involved in the prohibition process from those who administer the scheme, those who may make referrals to the NCTL about a teacher's conduct, witnesses who attend panel hearings and those teachers who appear before a Teacher Professional Conduct Panel.

- 1.3 The revisions are made following the Department's June announcement that the guidance would be revised to clarify the Department's expectation that other than in the most exceptional cases any sexual misconduct and any criminal conviction or caution involving indecent images of children will lead to prohibition.
- **1.4** It clarifies the advice in respect of a number of important factors that Teacher Professional Conduct Panels will need to consider when deciding whether to recommend a teacher should be prohibited.

Specifically the revisions indicate that:

- <u>any</u> sexual misconduct (not just 'serious sexual misconduct') should be a factor to be taken into account in considerations of prohibition; and
- any criminal conviction or caution that involves indecent images of children is likely to lead to prohibition.
