Byelaws Signage

As the review proceeds and new byelaws are made by the Secretary of State, it will

be necessary to replace existing byelaw notices and where necessary erect

additional signs on the byelaw boundaries to ensure they are properly marked in

accordance with the Military Lands Act 1892. A byelaw notice is an enlarged

reproduction of the current byelaw, including a map of the area covered by the

byelaw. The notice is printed on a metal sign and is normally located at site access

points to inform the public where a byelaw applies and will incorporate the use of

coloured maps.

Byelaws signs will follow the concepts of Controlled areas or Protected areas and will

indicate the extent of public access.

The new signage will be produced in a variety of sizes and materials designed to

meet each sites' individual needs.
