## EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHER IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF DENMARK CONFIRMING THE LIMITS OF THE UNITED KINGDOM'S EXCLUSIVE ECONOMIC ZONE IN THE NORTH SEA

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy, Copenhagen to the Royal Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs

22 October 2009

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy presents its compliments to the Royal Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and, acting upon instructions from the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, has the honour to state that, once the Marine and Coastal Access Bill currently before the United Kingdom Parliament becomes law, the United Kingdom is proposing to declare an Exclusive Economic Zone, in accordance with the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea. The Government of the United Kingdom's Exclusive Economic Zone will follow the limits of the United Kingdom's Exclusive Economic Zone will follow the boundary of the continental shelf between the Kingdom of Denmark and the United Kingdom, as set out in the Agreement dated 25 November 1971.<sup>1</sup>

The Government of the United Kingdom has further the honour to propose that, following discussions between the respective experts of the two States, the boundary set out in the aforesaid Agreement will be expressed on WGS84 Datum and joined by geodesics, as follows:

56°05'09.56"N 03°14'54.85"E
55°55'06.96"N 03°20'54.88"E

The Government of the United Kingdom can confirm that the Norwegian and German authorities are content with this formulation on WGS84 Datum of points 1 and 2, respectively.

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Kingdom of Denmark, the Government of the United Kingdom has the honour to suggest that the present Note Verbale and the Ministry's reply in the affirmative shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the two Governments.
