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Outcomes for Children Looked After by Local Authorities in England, as at 31 March 2011 – Additional Tables

Following the publication of the Statistical First Release in December; this publication provides further analysis for the outcomes of children looked after as at 31 March 2011. Figures are presented relating to Special Educational Needs (SEN) provision and attainment, absence and exclusions.

To be consistent with previous publications, looked after children are defined as those that have been continuously looked after for 12 months. Throughout this publication comparisons will be made between looked after children and all children in the National Pupil Database (NPD). The NPD is a longitudinal database providing linked pupil/student characteristics to attainment information for children in maintained schools in England.

The information is taken from the matched administrative data taken from the Children Looked After Database and the National Pupil Database (CLA-NPD). For further details of the data collection, matching process and methodology please refer to the Technical Notes in the main text for this SFR.

Key Points

- Of the children looked after continuously for at least 12 months on 31 March 2011, 72.8 per cent had SEN, an increase compared with 65.7 per cent in 2007. This is significantly higher than the 20.6 per cent of all children who had a SEN in 2011.
- At Key Stage 2, 30 per cent of looked after children with a SEN achieved the expected level in both English and mathematics compared with 78 per cent of looked after children without a SEN. In comparison, 35 per cent of all children with a SEN achieved the expected level.
- At Key Stage 4, 11.1 per cent of looked after children with a SEN achieved 5+ A*-C GCSEs including English and Mathematics compared with 34.3 per cent of looked after children without a SEN. In comparison, 22.1 per cent of all children with a SEN achieved 5+ A*-C GCSEs including English and mathematics.
- The overall absence rate for looked after children has fallen over the period 2007 to 2011 to 5.5 per cent in 2011. The absence rate for all children has fallen in these years to 5.8 per cent in 2011.
- In primary schools, 4.3 per cent of the school population of looked after children have had at least one fixed exclusion, 18.7 per cent of looked after children in secondary schools and 15.0 per cent of looked after children in special schools. This compares with 0.9 per cent, 8.6 per cent and 16.5 per cent of all children, respectively.

Special Educational Needs of Looked After Children


There were 28,440 children looked after continuously for 12 months during the year ending 31 March 2011 who were in the school population. Of these:

- 72.8 per cent had a SEN, compared with 72.6 per cent in 2010.
- 43.5 per cent were SEN without a statement with 13.8 per cent being School Action and 29.6 per cent being School Action Plus. This compares with the 2010 figures which were 42.7 per cent SEN without a statement, 14.3 per cent being School Action and 28.4 per cent being School Action Plus.
- 29.4 per cent were SEN with a statement, a decrease from 29.9 per cent in 2010.

A higher percentage of children looked after continuously for at least 12 months have a SEN than that of all children. From previously published figures on SEN¹, 20.6 per cent of all children had a SEN in 2011, comprising of 17.8 per cent SEN without a statement and 2.8 per cent SEN with a statement.

Over the period 2007 to 2011, the difference between looked after children and all children having a SEN has increased from 46.4 percentage points in 2007 to 52.2 percentage points in 2011. This widening is due to the percentage of looked after children with a SEN increasing over the period.

The most common type of SEN for looked after children with a statement in 2011 was Behavioural, Emotional and Social Difficulties, which 44.4 per cent had. The next most common was Moderate Learning Difficulty, which 18.9 per cent had, and Severe Learning Difficulty, which 9.9 per cent had. This compares with 14.2 per cent, 17.3 per cent and 12.3 per cent of all children with a statement, respectively¹.

Attainment of Looked After Children with a Special Educational Need at Key Stage 2

There were 2,090 children looked after continuously for at least 12 months at 31 March 2011 who were eligible to sit Key Stage 2 tests for which SEN information was available. Of these, 1,500 had a SEN and of these:

- 40 per cent achieved the expected level in English, a large increase of 4 percentage points compared with 2010.
- 40 per cent achieved the expected level in mathematics, an increase of 3 percentage points from 2010.
- 30 per cent achieved the expected level in both English and mathematics, 'The Basics', again an increase of 4 percentage points from 2010.

For each subject the percentage of children looked after continuously for at least 12 months with a SEN who achieved the expected level is lower than that achieved by all children with a SEN. The percentage of all children achieving the expected level was 47 per cent in English, 49 per cent in mathematics and 35 per cent in both English and mathematics².

The percentage of looked after children with a SEN achieving the expected level in English and mathematics has increased over the period 2007 to 2011 from 22 per cent to 30 per cent. From 2007 to 2011, the percentage of all children with a SEN achieving the expected level in both subjects has also increased by 6 percentage points². The attainment gap between looked after children and all children in achieving the expected level in English and mathematics is 5 percentage points in 2011, which is smaller than the same attainment gap of 7 percentage points in 2007.

Attainment of Looked After Children with a Special Educational Need at Key Stage 4

There were 4,600 children looked after continuously for at least 12 months on 31 March 2011 who were eligible to sit Key Stage 4 tests for which SEN information was available. Of these, 2,660 had a SEN and of these:

- 35.1 per cent achieved 5 or more GCSE at grades A*-C, a large increase of almost 6 percentage points compared with 2010.
- 11.1 per cent achieved 5 or more GCSE including English and mathematics at grades A*-C, a small increase compared with the 2010 figure of 10.7 per cent.
- 11.7 per cent achieved A*-C in English and mathematics, the Basics, a small increase compared with 11.2 per cent in 2010.

For each indicator the proportion of children looked after continuously for 12 months who had a SEN and achieved that measure is lower than the proportion of all children with an SEN achieving it. The percentage of all children with an SEN achieving 5 or more GCSEs at grade A*-C is 53.8 per cent, achieving 5 or more GCSEs including English and mathematics at grades A*-C is 22.1 per cent and 22.7 per cent achieved A*-C in English and mathematics GCSE³.


Although attainment of looked after children with a SEN has increased throughout the period 2007 to 2011, the rate at which attainment by all children with a SEN has increased has been faster resulting in a broadening of the attainment gap³.

In 2011 there is an 11.0 percentage point difference between looked after children with a SEN and all children with a SEN achieving 5 or more GCSEs including English and mathematics at grades A*-C, up

from an attainment gap of 6.6 percentage points in 2007.

Additionally there is an 18.7 percentage point difference in achieving 5 or more GCSEs at grades A*-C between looked after children with a SEN and all children with a SEN, a larger gap than in 2007 when it was 10.5 percentage points (achieved by 20.9 per cent of all children with an SEN and 10.4 per cent of looked after children with an SEN).

Absence of Looked After Children

There were 29,640 children looked after continuously for 12 months during the year ending 31 March 2011 who were eligible for full time schooling of which 26,340 were enrolled at an educational establishment. Of these:

- The authorised absence rate for looked after children in the 2011 academic year was 4.0 per cent, a small decrease from 4.3 per cent in 2010.
- The unauthorised absence rate for looked after children in the 2011 academic year was 1.5 per cent, which has remained static from the previous year.
- The overall absence rate for looked after children in the 2011 academic year was 5.5 per cent, a small decrease from 5.8 per cent in 2010.

Over the period 2007 to 2011 overall absence for looked after children has fallen from 7.1 per cent in 2007 to 5.5 per cent in 2011. Similarly this has also occurred for all children with overall absence falling from 6.5 per cent in 2007 to 5.8 per cent in 2011⁴. From 2009, the overall absence of looked after children has been lower than for all children with a gap of 0.3 percentage points in 2011.

The rates for overall absence of looked after children according to school type are as follows; 3.3 per cent in primary schools, 6.5 per cent in secondary schools and 7.7 per cent in special schools. This compares to 5.0 per cent, 6.5 per cent and 10.0 per cent for all children respectively.

The percentage of looked after children classed as a 'persistent absentee' is previously defined as those with an absence rate of over 20 per cent. Based on this definition the percentage of looked after children classed as a 'persistent absentee' in 2011 remains as it was in 2010, at 4.2 per cent. However, a new definition has been introduced for 2011 which defines a 'persistent absentee' as having an absent rate of over 15 per cent. Based on this definition, 6.5 per cent of looked after children are classed as a 'persistent absentee' in 2011. Both definitions have been presented in 2011 to enable a comparison with earlier years, however in future years only the new definition will be published.

Exclusions for Looked After Children

The most recent year we have data for exclusions is 2010 due to the timings of the exclusions data collection. There were 29,240 children looked after continuously for 12 months during the year ending 31 March 2010 who were eligible for full time schooling of which 25,930 were enrolled in an educational establishment.

The percentage of looked after children with at least one fixed period exclusion has fallen over the period 2007 to 2010. 21.4 per cent of looked after children in secondary schools had at least one fixed period exclusion in 2007, compared with 18.7 per cent in 2010.

The rates of children with at least one fixed exclusion are higher for children looked after for at least 12 months than for all children. In primary schools, 4.3 per cent of the school population of looked after children have had at least one fixed exclusion, 18.7 per cent in secondary schools and 15.02 per cent in special schools. This compares with 0.9 per cent, 8.6 per cent and 16.5 per cent of all children, respectively⁵.

Over the same time period, the average length of a fixed period exclusion has also fallen for all types of school; however this still remains higher for looked after children than all children. In primary schools the average length of exclusion for looked after children is 4.5 days, 5.3 days in secondary schools and 4.3 days in special schools. This is compared with 2.1 days, 2.5 days and 2.2 days respectively for all children⁵

For permanent exclusions in 2010, rates were higher for children who had been looked after for at least 12 months compared with all children: 0.18 per cent of looked after children who attended primary schools had been permanently excluded compared with 0.02 per cent of all children, and 0.40 per cent of looked after children who attended secondary schools had been permanently excluded compared to 0.15 per cent of all children⁵.
