From our preliminary assessment, we estimate that complying with the request to provide information on the job titles and grades of agency staff would exceed the cost limit of £600 provided under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act. This represents the estimated cost of spending 3.5 working days: (i) determining whether the department holds the information, and (ii) locating, retrieving and extracting the information. The Act provides that we are not obliged to comply with requests where the estimated cost of complying would exceed this limit. The Department's current recording system does not capture details of every

individual employed in BIS through third parties centrally. This information could only be obtained by reviewing each individual contract. This exercise is estimated to take longer than the 3.5 working day limit.
