# REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Consultancy and Project Advisory Costs in the financial year 2012/13

Thank you for your request for information about consultancy costs in 2012/13, which we received on 13 September. As you know, we have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

#### You asked:

- 1. How much has your department spent on consultancy costs in the financial year 2012/2013
- 2. How much has your department spent on project advisory costs in the financial year 2012/2013?
- 3. What were the three biggest single payments for individual contracts, who was the payment made to and provide a two sentence summary of what the consultancy was for?

The information you requested is as follows:

- 1. Details of Defra's expenditure on consultancy can be found in the table on page 51 of the Department's Annual Report and Accounts 2012-13 (https://www.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment\_data/file/224329/def ra-year-end-accounts2012-13.pdf)
- 2. The Department's financial system does not record project advisory costs as a separate category of expenditure. It is therefore not possible to answer this part of your request.





## 3. The three biggest single payments for individual consultancy contracts in 2012/13 were:

Liberata UK Ltd	409,288.00	Provision of Nitrate Vulnerable Zone appeal charges: Provision of administrative services for handling of appeal documents and arranging paper and oral hearings; judicial determination of appeals; and issue to parties to the appeal of determinations (decisions) taken on appeals.
Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer	234,461.17	Commercial legal advice between 1 April 2012 and 31 March 2013 for the Thames Tideway Tunnel Project.
Treasury Solicitor	167,120.19	Legal Services on Major Projects - Thames Tunnel Order. Covering Financial Year 2012/13.
