What are the policy/process objectives and aims?

The policy sets out how the ILF will consider circumstances in which a user is supported through an adult placement\shared lives scheme. The emphasis of the policy is on ensuring that users are able to maintain choice and control over how their funding is used in line with Independent Living principles.

In particular the policy states that users should have as much choice and control over their lives as possible, whilst recognising that the nature of such schemes may restrict the choice of care provider. This position reflects the remit of the ILF in providing financial support to individuals to live independently within their communities.

Please state the reasons why the changes are taking place.

The policy has been amended following the decision to close the ILF and transfer the responsibility to meet eligible support needs to the local authorities in England and the devolved administrations elsewhere in the UK. The revision is intended to facilitate any transfer arrangements without impacting upon a users choice and control.

The revision enables the ILF to accept the LA judgement as to whether the Adult placement arrangements are best suited to the users circumstances and provide adequate choice and control for the user. Changes to ILF procedure allow for the Care Schedule to be the only place where the Local Authority input needs to be detailed.
