

# Regional breakdown of Government measures in Budget 2013

## NORTHERN IRELAND

- 7,000 people to be lifted out of income tax as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 130,000 children in working families with the cost of childcare
- 1.1 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 25,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £35 million, with 10,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- Carbon Price Floor: the exemption for Northern Ireland will support the Northern Irish economy and protect energy security in the region.
- Aerospace cluster based around Northern Ireland will benefit from access to £2.1 billion Aerospace Technology Institute (ATI) which will support research and development in this key UK sector
- Help to Buy: for an average home mover in Northern Ireland, a 90 per cent mortgage would require a deposit of around £15,000. With a 95 per cent mortgage they would require a £7,500 deposit.

## NORTH EAST

- 14,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 931,000 to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 234,000 children in working families in the North East with the cost of childcare
- 80,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 1.27 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 25,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £35 million, with 15,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £80 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- £60 million will be invested since 2010 to build over 3,300 Affordable Homes
- Help to buy: An average first-time buyer in the North East would require a £5,500 deposit with a 95 per cent mortgage

## NORTH WEST

- 29,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 2.6 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 710,000 children in working families in the North West with the cost of childcare
- 140,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 3.6 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 95,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £125 million, with 55,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £228 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- £180 million to build 9,400 Affordable Homes

## SCOTLAND

- 23,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 2.17 million to pay less income tax as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 310,000 children in working families in Scotland with the cost of childcare
- 70,000 businesses in Scotland to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £100 million, with 35,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- 2.7 million owners of vehicles in Scotland to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- Oil and Gas: the Government will sign contracts later this year to provide certainty on decommissioning relief on the UK Continental Shelf
- 319,000 small and medium enterprises in Scotland will benefit from business support measures

## YORKSHIRE AND HUMBER

- 21,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 1.9 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reform
- Tax free childcare could go towards helping some of the 490,000 children in working families in Yorkshire and Humber
- 110,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 2.7 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 65,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £90 million, with 30,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £100 million to build nearly 5,000 Affordable Homes
- £174 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- 345,000 small and medium enterprises to benefit from business support measures

## WEST MIDLANDS

- 22,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 2 million to pay less income tax as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare scheme will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 508,000 children in working families in the West Midlands
- 150,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 3.5 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 70,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £100 million, with 35,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £190 million to build over 9,000 Affordable Homes
- £179 million available for discounted borrowing for councils to be spent on infrastructure projects
- Help to buy: for an average home-mover in the West Midlands, a 90 per cent mortgage would require a deposit of around £21,000. With a 95 per cent mortgage they would require a £10,500 deposit.

## EAST MIDLANDS

- 21,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 1.75 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 460,000 children in working families with the cost of childcare
- 120,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 2.7 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 60,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £85 million, with 30,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £72 million to build over 4,000 Affordable Homes
- £176 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- 325,000 small and medium enterprises to benefit from business support measures

## WALES

- 12,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 1.11 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 170,000 children in working families with the cost of childcare
- 110,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 1.8 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 35,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £50 million, with 20,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- The Government is continuing to discuss options for funding improvements to the M4 in south Wales with the Welsh Government, alongside an assessment of the Silk Commission's recommendations
- Help to buy: for an average home mover in Wales, a 90 per cent mortgage would require a deposit of around £18,000. With a 95 per cent mortgage they would require a £9,000 deposit.

## EAST OF ENGLAND

- 22,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 2.3 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 624,000 children in working families with the cost of childcare
- 120,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 3.6 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 90,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £120 million, with 45,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £100 million to build over 8,000 Affordable Homes
- £124 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- Help to buy: for an average home-mover in the East of England, a 90 per cent mortgage would require a deposit of around £28,500. With a 95 per cent mortgage they would require a £14,500 deposit

## SOUTH WEST

- 21,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 2.13 million to pay less income tax as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 528,000 children in working families in the South West with the cost of childcare
- 110,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 3.5 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 80,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £120 million, with 40,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £140 million to build nearly 9,000 Affordable Homes
- £173 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- 477,000 small and medium enterprises to benefit from business support measures

## LONDON

- 30,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 3.19 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 624,000 children in working families in London with the cost of childcare
- 135,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 3 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 145,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £195 million, with 75,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £600 million to build just over 20,000 new Affordable Homes
- 805,000 small and medium enterprises to benefit from business support measures
- £8 million funding over the next two years for the Skills Investment Fund

## SOUTH EAST

- 30,000 people to be lifted out of income tax and 3.57 million to pay less as a result of Personal Allowance reforms
- Tax-free childcare will go towards helping with childcare costs for some of the 886,000 children in working families in the South East
- 150,000 older people will benefit from the introduction of a cap on reasonable care costs, brought forward to April 2016
- 5.6 million owners of vehicles to benefit from the cancellation of the fuel duty rise
- 140,000 businesses to benefit from the new Employment Allowance by £195 million, with 70,000 of these businesses taken out of employer NICs altogether
- £220 million to build nearly 15,000 Affordable Homes
- £367 million of discounted borrowing for councils for infrastructure projects
- Help to buy: for an average home-mover in the South East, a 90 per cent mortgage would require a deposit of around £33,500. With a 95 per cent mortgage they would require a £17,000 deposit
