# ADMISSION APPEALS FOR MAINTAINED PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN ENGLAND 2009/10

#### INTRODUCTION

This annual Statistical First Release provides information about appeals lodged by parents during the academic year 2009/10 against non-admission of their children to their preferred school. It includes all appeals lodged during the academic year across all year groups. Information is provided on the number and percentage of appeals that have been lodged by parents; heard by an appeals panel and decided in favour of the parents.

# **KEY POINTS (Tables 1 and 2)**

#### Infant classes

- In infant classes within maintained primary schools, 27,885 appeals were lodged in 2009/10 compared with 23,810 in 2008/09. (table 1)
- 19,220 appeals were heard by a panel in 2009/10 compared with 16,410 in the previous year; this represents 3.0 per cent of all new admissions to infant classes within maintained primary schools, compared with 2.6 per cent in the previous year. (table 1)
- 3,105 appeals were decided in favour of the parents in 2009/10 compared with 2,585 in the previous year; this represents 16.1 per cent of appeals heard by a panel in 2009/10, compared with 15.8 per cent in the previous year. (table 1)

# Maintained primary schools (including infant classes)

- In 2009/10, 42,070 appeals were lodged for admission to maintained primary schools, compared to 38,080 in 2008/09. (table 1)
- 28,715 appeals were heard by a panel in 2009/10 compared with 25,885 in the previous year. This represents 3.5 per cent of all new admissions to maintained primary schools in 2009/10, compared with 3.1 per cent in the previous year. (table 1)
- 7,045 appeals were decided in favour of the parents in 2009/10 compared with 6,460 in the previous year; this represents 24.5 per cent of appeals heard by a panel in 2009/10, compared with 25.0 per cent in the previous year. (table 1)

# Maintained secondary schools (please see Technical Note 2 for details of how changes in coverage impact on year-on-year comparisons)

- In maintained secondary schools, 43,095 appeals were lodged in 2009/10, a decrease compared to 2008/09. (table 1)
- 32,135 appeals were heard by a panel in 2009/10; this represents 5.0 per cent of all new admissions to maintained secondary schools. (table 1)
- 11,065 appeals were decided in favour of the parents in 2009/10; this represents 34.4 per cent of appeals heard by a panel, compared with 33.3 per cent in the previous year. (table 1)

#### **TECHNICAL NOTES**

## **Background**

- Admission authorities (local authorities (LAs) for community and voluntary controlled schools and governing bodies for voluntary aided (VA) and foundation schools) are required under the 1998 School Standards and Framework Act to constitute an independent appeal panel to hear appeals by parents against the non-admission of their child to a school for which they have expressed a preference.
- 2. The data reported are for local authority maintained schools only, as in previous publications. The admission appeals exercise doesn't include academies and the recent rapid growth in academies has affected the figures, mainly for secondary schools in 2009/10. Caution is therefore needed when making year-on-year comparisons. In September 2010, 137 schools converted to academy status, 37 primary and 100 secondary. It is estimated that this may have contributed to the decrease in appeals in secondary schools in 2009/10 by around 1,400 1,700. In addition, 63 sponsor led academies opened in autumn 2009 and it is estimated that this might account for around a further 900 appeals. The actual decrease shown is 7,100 so not all of this can be explained by new academies. There is little additional evidence to fully explain the decrease in appeals but the decreasing pupil numbers in the secondary sector is likely to be a factor. In addition, the opening of new provision (academies) may have reduced the need for appeals.
- 3. Information presented in this Statistical First Release (SFR) is derived from two sources: the Survey of Admission Appeals and the School Census. LAs provided appeal data for their Community and Voluntary Controlled schools via the Survey of Admission Appeals. Voluntary Aided (VA) and Foundation schools provided appeal data via the School Census. Figures relating to admissions are calculated from the School Census for all schools.
- 4. The data include some large variations at LA level in the numbers of new admissions when comparing 2009/10 with 2008/09. This can be as a result of changes in provision at the LA, e.g. new schools opening, amalgamations and closures, or new sixth forms. It should also be noted that some of the variability is a result of differing admission arrangements amongst authorities. For example, some LAs admit pupils in August rather than the more standard arrangements in September.
- 5. The total number of appeals lodged by parents against the non-admission of their children can be misleading. Some appeals are resolved before they reach a panel hearing (a place at an alternative school is accepted after an appeal has been lodged; the same parent can lodge appeals for more than one school but will not pursue them all). Figures for the total number of admission appeals lodged are given in this publication but the number of appeals heard by an appeals panel is deemed to be the more reliable and critical indicator.

# **Methodology Changes**

- 6. In 2007/08 we made some improvements to the way in which admission numbers were calculated. Following further analysis of the data a further change was made to the way admission numbers were calculated for 2008/09. Essentially all nursery class pupils are now excluded from the count of admissions.
- 7. Apart from the nursery class change explained above, admissions continue to be based on start dates between 1 September and the January census date. Some pupils are admitted at other

- times of the year and these are not included in the admission numbers in this SFR. All admission numbers are based on pupils on roll at the time of the January School Census.
- 8. A number of pupil based outputs, including this SFR, now include dually registered pupils (the main dual registration). Previously only sole registrations were included. This increases the number of admissions in this SFR. In most years the increase is marginal but changes to the registration policy in 2010 have led to a more marked increase in 2010 compared to previous years.

#### **Data Coverage / Revisions**

9. - 10. Pupil numbers at national and regional levels have been rounded to the nearest 5. Pupil numbers of 1 or 2 have been suppressed being replaced in the table by an 'x'. Where any number is shown as zero (0), the original figure was also zero. Where the numerator or denominator of any percentage calculated on pupil numbers is less than 3, this has been replaced by an 'x'.

  - x small number suppressed to preserve confidentiality (see Technical Note 8)
  - . not applicable
