**CPOSA Subscriptions**

Members at the APA Council Meeting on 18th July raised a number of issues around CPOSA subscriptions particularly in relation to legal expenses and professional indemnity insurance. For colleagues not present at Council, the APA and APACE have met with CPOSA representatives to discuss the issues. The meeting was constructive and a number of 'next steps' have been agreed with a view to hopefully resolving the issue shortly. We are likely to be moving to a system with payment being a matter for individuals but hoping to establish some key principles around it. As soon as a way forward has been agreed with CPOSA we will update colleagues accordingly.
