Re: December 2012 stop smoking advertisement

Thank you for your email dated 2 December 2013 in which you asked for information around the 'Mutation' advertisement campaign to encourage smoking cessation.

Your email has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act. In accordance with Section 1(1)(a) of the Act I can confirm that Public Health England (PHE) does hold some of the information requested.

The advertisement was intended to target all smokers in England; however there was a particular focus on smokers who work in routine and manual jobs, since they exhibit significantly higher smoking prevalence than professional and managerial groups, and account for around half of all smokers. The production cost for the television advertisement was £200,000, rounded to the nearest £10,000. The advertisement received 17 complaints through the Advertising Standards Authority (ASA).
