## **RE: Freedom of Information Request**

Further to your recent request for information under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 2000, dated 18th November 2013, which read:

Would you please supply your latest complete year figures of amounts paid to the electrical generating companies in constraint payments broken down by fuel used

Constraint payments are made by National Grid, not DECC, through competitive market arrangements, in order to ensure the secure operation of the electricity system. The only information held by DECC of relevance to your request has been taken from publicly available websites. Under section 21 of the Act, we are not required to provide this information as it is already reasonably accessible to you from the following sources:

- National Grid's Procurement Guidelines Report 2012/13 sets out the costs of resolving constraints through different mechanisms. See: http://www2.nationalgrid.com/WorkArea/DownloadAsset.aspx?id=24878
- Page 32 of National Grid's Monthly Balancing Services Summary (October 2013) sets out the relatively small proportion of constraint payments made to wind powered generation in each financial year since 2010/11. Our understanding is that almost all other constraint payments relate to fossil fuel generators. See: http://www2.nationalgrid.com/WorkArea/DownloadAsset.aspx?id=28139
