Further breakdowns for serious proven re-offending of adult offenders in England and Wales released from custodial sentences of less than 12 months, by region

Background

This ad-hoc statistical notice presents further breakdowns of already published information on proven re-offending.

On Monday 4 November 2013, the Ministry of Justice published an ad-hoc statistical notice presenting statistics on the number of adult offenders in England and Wales who were released from a custodial sentence of less than 12 months between 2000 and 2011 and went on to commit a serious proven re-offence. We are now publishing equivalent figures for each region in England and Wales. Please note that regions cannot be compared without controlling for offender characteristics known to be associated with further offending.

Table 1 in this statistical notice provides information on the number of adult offenders in England and Wales who were released from a custodial sentence of less than 12 months between 2005 and 2011 and went on to commit a serious proven re-offence, by region. A proven re-offence is defined as any offence committed in a 12 month follow-up period and resulting in a court conviction, caution, reprimand or warning in either the 12 month follow-up period or within a further six month waiting period (to allow time for the offence to be proven in court).

These figures use a Home Office definition of serious offences; the list of offences included is set out in *Annex A* of the *Definitions and Measurement* document available at the link above. This classification is based on the definition used by a legacy Home Office performance indicator designed to support the delivery of public sector agreement 23: 'Make communities safer'.

- 1. This table represents a further breakdown of statistics published in the *Proven Re-offending Statistics Quarterly Bulletin, January to December 2011*, Table 19a 2. Data are shown from 2005 as the address data from the Police National Computer (PNC) are not of sufficient quality prior to this date
- 3. The region is based on the offender's address at the time of their most recent offence
- 4. Note that it is not appropriate to compare proven re-offending rates for different areas without controlling for offender characteristics
- 5. Includes serious violent, sexual and serious acquisitive offences

- 6. This does not represent all offenders offenders who are released from custody are matched to the Police National Computer and those who cannot be matched are excluded from the offender cohort. For each year, the total number of offenders also include a small number of offenders who could not be assigned to a region.
- 7. An offender is counted only once in the total which, therefore, does not equal the sum of 'serious violent or sexual' and 'serious acquisitive' (as a small number of offenders committed both types of serious re-offence)

Numbers in italics means less than 30 offenders - treat data with caution

- * Proportions and averages based on less than 30 offenders are removed as they make data unreliable for interpretation
- * Numbers based on less than five offenders are suppressed for confidentiality reasons
