The policy applies equally to all ILF users. We have not identified any potential negative impacts of the policy.			

What are the policy/process objectives and aims?

The current policy describes how the ILF will continue to suppport users who are abroad by continuing to fund their support during these periods. The policy reflects the remit of the ILF to support users to live independently within their communities and in doing so to have choice and control over their lives. In particular it states that users are able to employ providers not registered or resident in the UK when the user is abroad.

The policy is subject to users continuing to meet the ILF eligibility requirements.

Please state the reasons why the changes are taking place.

As it is unclear whether individual Local Authorities will also fund this type of support the revision advises that where users currently have employed carers abroad in line with the ILF policy but where the Local Authority will not support this following the closure of the ILF at the end of March 2015 users should be made aware of this so they are prepared for the change after the transfer in 2015. The revised policy also informs ILF staff to be cautious when agreeing to future care abroad dates in-case they coincide with the transfer date.

Details of amendment

On 6 November 2013, the Court of Appeal quashed the Government's decision that was made on 18 December 2012 to close the Independent Living Fund (ILF). All activity relating to the Transfer Review Programme has therefore ceased. The policy has been amended to remove a paragraph advising assessors to consider if the arrangements would be supported by the local authority following transfer.

Reason why a new EIA is not required

This amendment has no impact on the protected characteristics

Date of amendment 7 March 2014

Details of amendment

On 6 March 2014 the Government made a decision to close the Independent Living Fund (ILF) on 30 June 2015. The funding and responsibility for users ILF care and support needs will be transferred to local authorities in England and the devolved administrations in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland from 1 July 2015. The ILF commenced a Transfer Review Support Programme (TRSP) on 7 March 2014.

The policy has been updated to include a paragraph advising assessors to consider if the arrangements would be supported by the local authority following transfer.

Reason why a new EIA is not required

The current EIA does not identify any negative impact on the protected characteristics as the policy is intended to be applied to each group equally.

The revisions to the policy do not affect this impact and therefore a new EIA is not required.
