REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: EXTERNAL MEDIA TRAINING COURSES

Thank you for your request for information about external media training and Parliamentary Select Committee training courses, which we received on 9 October 2013. As you know, we have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You asked:

"How many (a) civil servants and (b) ministers have been sent on external media training course in each of the past three years?

How much has been spent sending (a) civil servants and (b) ministers on external media training course for each of the past three years?

How many (a) civil servants and (b) ministers have attended National School of Government training courses on appearing before Parliamentary Select Committees in each of the past three years?

How much has been spent sending (a) civil servants and (b) ministers to National School of Government training courses on appearing before Parliamentary Select Committees for each of the past three years?"

We want to be as helpful as possible in answering requests. However we are unable to provide a reply for the 3 years from April 2010 to March 2013 for any of the above categories. Section 12(1) of the FOIA allows us to refuse a request for information if we estimate that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit, which currently stands at £600 and divert resources from the Department's other work. As most of the information required to answer this question is not stored centrally and the National School for Government closed in March 2012 we consider that the cost of gathering all of the data you require would exceed this limit and, as such, we are refusing these parts of your request.





The easily accessible information we have on the number of (a) civil servants and (b) Ministers attending Civil Service Learning media training courses since April 2013 is as follows:

- (a) Civil Servants 7
- (b) Ministers 0

The total spends for (a) Civil Servants is £1,672.

The total spends for (b) ministers is nil.

These figures are for core Defra.

The FOIA also requires us to help people obtain information they are looking for. In such cases, we usually offer the requester the opportunity to make a new request for a narrower category of information. However, as the information is not held centrally, there does not appear to be a way that your request could be narrowed that would enable us to provide an answer.

In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOIA, all information is assumed to be releasable to the public unless exempt. Therefore, the information released to you may now be published on our website together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context.

I attach Annex A, which explains the copyright that applies to the information being released to you.

I also attach Annex B giving contact details should you be unhappy with the service you have received.
