Executive summary

- 1. The department continues to make good progress against the priorities set by the coalition government as laid out in its Business Plan. The narrative below and annex A tracks progress in achieving these objectives between April and September 2013.
- 2. We are working to boost housing supply to meet the needs and aspirations of hard working families and to support economic growth. We are starting to see the results from the £11.5 billion of public investment between 2011-12 and 2014-15 as well as the substantial private sector investment being leveraged in. Construction data shows that output is at its best since 2007 and house building starts for the past year to September 2013 have increased by 16%- rising to over 117,000. Similarly, our planning reforms are starting to bite- in the year to September 2013, 167,000 units were approved in England on major sites. This is 35% higher than the previous year, following the introduction of National Planning Policy Framework.
- 3. In April 2013, we launched the Help to Buy: Equity Loan scheme. In the first eight months of the scheme, over 20,000 families have reserved a new home. Within the first six months over 5,000 households have now become homeowners, of which 92 per cent were first-time buyers. The re-invigorated Right to Buy scheme continues to gain momentum, in particular owing to increased discounts- 5,000 sales were achieved in the first half of the year, over three times higher than in the same period in 2012-13.
- 4. In June 2013, the Spending Round 2013 announced £3.4 billion of additional capital investment, providing long term investment of £957 million per annum for three years in affordable housing. The department has also taken on a new role on behalf of the government to dispose of public sector surplus land, through the Homes and Communities Agency.
- 5. The department continues to work in partnership across government to incentivise local growth through Enterprise Zones and Local Enterprise Partnerships. In June, we announced £59 million investment for infrastructure projects in Enterprise Zones. We have continued to back local initiatives by supporting the development of City Deals- for example, the Preston City Deal will enable over 17,000 new homes to be built, free up land for new development and create more than 20,000 jobs.
- 6. As well as additional housing investment and increased flexibilities for councils, the Autumn Statement 2013 announced a £1 billion package on business rates. We are introducing a two year £1,000 business rates discount for shops, pubs and restaurants with rateable values below £50,000. This, alongside wider measures such as capping the scheduled Retail Price Index increase at 2% in 2014-15 for all businesses, will make a real difference to small businesses and town centres.
- 7. Whilst the need to reduce the deficit means that local government funding has decreased, we are paving the way for councils to radically transform local service delivery and achieve better outcomes for their residents for less. For example, from April, councils are now able to directly retain nearly £11 billion of

business rates, giving them a strong incentive to promote local growth, and in October we announced the 18 successful bidders for the £6.9 million Transformation Challenge Award.

- 8. The department continues to be committed to helping troubled families turn their lives around by 2015. By October, we had turned around 22,000 families and, alongside councils and their partners, we continue to work with a further 62,000 families. Furthermore, the recent Autumn Statement 2013 protected councils from further spending cuts and, to support hard-working families, we have enabled council tax to be frozen for five successive years.
- 9. The Spending Round 2013 illustrates the government's commitment to creating more efficient and sustainable councils. In 2015-16 £3.8 billion of pooled health and social care funding will be invested to drive integration of health and social care services through the Better Care Fund. This will support local authorities to work more effectively with Clinical Commissioning Groups to deliver better outcomes for less for the most vulnerable members of society and ensure care is centred round the individual.
- 10. We continue to support delivery of high quality services that create safe and resilient communities. Supported by the department, Sir Ken Knight produced his review of fire and rescue authorities in May and the Government response will set the agenda for more efficient fire and rescue services, incentivised through a £75 million Transformation Fund. The department also supported local responders through a range of emergencies, including the recent floods, and put contingency arrangements in place for firefighter industrial action.
- 11. In partnership with local businesses, voluntary organisations and communities, we are supporting local people to create stronger, more integrated communities. For example, in June 2013, we invited bids for the delivery of an English language community-based learning programme, representing an investment of up to £6 million.

Financial Performance

- 14. The table below sets out the department's financial position for DCLG Communities DEL and DCLG Local Government DEL as of 30 September in comparison to the budget as agreed at Main Estimates 2013-14 and the position at 30 September 2012.
- 15. DCLG Communities DEL has spent more to date this year in a number of areas in comparison to the same point last year reflecting that overall budgets have also increased. It also reflects that a number of key new programmes from Spending Round 2010, such as the Weekly Collection Support Scheme, the Affordable Homes Programme and Regional Growth Fund, are now embedded. Costs have notionally increased in 2013-14 for DCLG Staff, Building and Infrastructure owing to a one-off payment to move out of the department's current main building into shared accommodation with the Home Office in Marsham Street. The Home Office transferred the budget to cover this, but it needed to go through the department's books. However, this move to Marsham Street will save the department £9 million a year from 2015-16, and will save taxpayers £220 million over the lifetime of lease commitments to 2025. The underlying direction of administration spending is substantially downwards.
- 16. Spending power, which is a measure of the overall impact of decisions on local authority spending, reduced by 1.3% on average compared to last year. This includes a reduction of £3.2 billion in Local Government DEL spending compared to 2012-13.
- 17. As part of the Supplementary Estimate to be submitted later this month, the department will seek approval for a number of changes. For DCLG Communities DEL, we will be receiving new funding for the Local Infrastructure Fund and a new Right to Buy Fund. We will be requesting budget exchange to ensure that budget profiles align to actual likely spending profiles. As announced at Autumn Statement 2013, our resource budget will also be reduced by £24 million and £13 million in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively. Finally, we will be undertaking a series of routine transfers with other government departments to support our local growth, integration, fire and public sector land programmes
- 18. We will be increasing DCLG Local Government DEL by around £400 million to provide funding for the council tax freeze, and for small business rates and empty property reliefs announced at Autumn Statement 2012. Following an internal review of arms length bodies, we are transferring the Valuation Tribunal Service and the Commission for Local Administration in England from DCLG Local Government to DCLG Communities DEL.

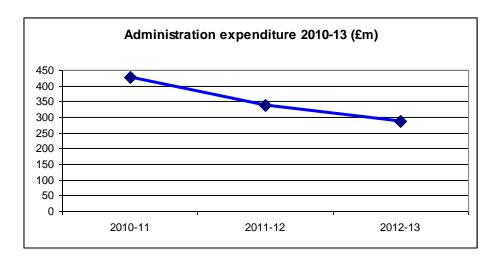

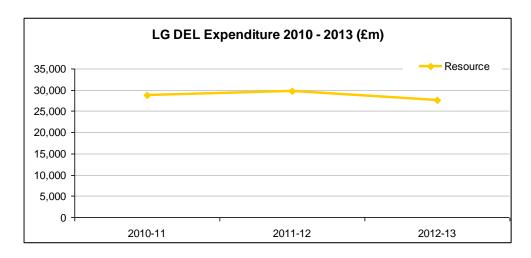

- 21. The graph above shows our administration expenditure since 2010, reflecting how we are saving taxpayers' money through restructuring the department where we have achieved around a 40% reduction in headcount on a like for like basis. Full expenditure data for DCLG Communities and Local Government DEL can be found at annex C. This shows that the department's resource and capital funding have decreased in this period as part of our commitment at Spending Round 2010 to deliver savings for government of 51% on resource spending and 74% on capital spending by March 2015. Key areas which have contributed in 2011-12 and 2012-13 towards this have been the planned closure of key arms length bodies such as the Government Offices and the Regional Development Agencies, the transfer for funding for Supporting People to Local Government DEL, and the closure of key projects such as Fire Control.
- 22. The decrease between 2011-12 and 2012-13 is less in comparison to the previous year, because the department secured additional funding for new programmes, such as Troubled Families. In 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16, there will be an increase in departmental spending which will reflect the £8 billion of additional investment the department is making in housing and local growth announced since Spending Round 2010.

23. The increase in 2011-12 is owing to additional funding being secured for council tax freeze grant.

People

24. The table below provides an overview of the department's organisational make-up. Since 30 September 2012, the department has increased its contingent labour and has sought more recruitment exemptions. This is required to support the substantial new investment in housing and local growth announced since Spending Round 2010. Since the publication of the department's annual report, we have received the People Survey results for 2013. These show an increase of 6% in the engagement index- joint highest across Whitehall.
