REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Rhydymwyn Tunnels – Radon Gas

Thank you for your request for further information on Radon gas at Rhydymwyn, which we received on 22nd October 2013. As you know, we have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

I would like, please, to obtain all radon readings, logs, correspondence and emails relating to radon before February 2013. I would also like to obtain copies of all correspondence, readings and logs before, during and after the August readings, including any emails to date.

Please find attached a copy of the information for records prior to February 2013. All other documents have been released.

Finally, I would like copies of all correspondence, emails, readings and logs referring to radon readings, on any other parts of the Rhydymwyn site.

The only other buildings identified in documents relating to radon are the Visitors Centre. All documents relating to this have been released.

In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOIA and the government's Transparency Agenda, all information is assumed to be releasable to the public unless exempt. Therefore, the information released to you will now be published on www.gov.uk together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. Please note that this will not include your personal data.
