- · A list of all meetings attended by Brian Wilson, since his appointment in his capacity as Business Ambassador, broken down by subject of the meeting, location and the details of who attended.
- · The expenses claimed by Brian Wilson, broken down by individual claim and date, and all other costs associated with his duties as a Business Ambassador."

I have carried out a search of both our paper and electronic records and I have established that this information is not held by the Department of Energy and Climate Change.
