# Public Expenditure 2002-2003 Provisional Outturn

### Public Expenditure 2002-03 Provisional Outturn

### **Total Managed Expenditure**

This White Paper reports provisional outturn figures for public spending in 2002-03 providing information on DEL and AME, including voted spending and administration costs limits. All departments are described as they were constituted at the end of 2002-03.

Spending by the public sector as a whole is known as Total Managed Expenditure (TME). Within TME there are two important aggregates. Departmental Expenditure Limits (DEL) covers spending for which firm three-year plans are capable of being set. Annually Managed Expenditure (AME) is subject to annual review as part of the Budget process.

### Resource Accounting and Budgeting

With effect from 1 April 2001, Government spending moved from being accounted for on a cash basis to an accruals basis. This White Paper reports outturn for the main control aggregates and departmental control limits on an accruals basis. As noted above, the outturn figures are provisional and may be subject to some adjustment when the final accounts are available.

### **Departmental Expenditure Limits**

Provisional outturn for DEL in 2002-03 was £233.135 billion – £5.810 billion (2.43 per cent) below the final limits. **Table 1A** (resources) and **Table 1B** (capital) show outturn against original and final limits by department. There was one breach. Limits can be changed during the course of the year for a variety of reasons including Machinery of Government (MoG) changes involving the transfer of functions between departments. Comparisons between provisional outturn and original limits can therefore be misleading. The outturn figures form the basis of the calculations to determine department's End Year Flexibility (EYF) entitlements for DEL shown in Table 6.

The final totals for DEL in Public Expenditure Statistical Analyses (PESA) 2003 (Cm 5901) were £206.3 billion for resources DEL and £27.4 bn for Capital DEL. Provisional outturn for these aggregates on the same basis as PESA were £205.1 billion for resource DEL and £28.0 billion for capital DEL.

### **Annually Managed Expenditure**

Provisional outturn for AME in 2002-03 was £186.774 billion. **Table 2** shows outturn against the *PESA 2002-03* and *PESA 2003-04* forecasts consistent with the groupings in Table 1.3 of that document. Estimated outturn for AME in PESA was forecast at £187.4 billion. Provisional outturn for AME, on the same basis as PESA, was £186.7 billion.

### Central government voted expenditure

Provisional outturn in 2002-03 for voted resource spending was £310.420 billion -£9.241 billion (2.89 per cent) less than final provision and for voted cash spending £290.237 billion -£8.256 billion (2.77 per cent) less than final provision. **Table 3** shows outturn, original provision and final provision by Estimate and Request for Resources (RfR). There were two overspends. Those RfRs subject to Machinery of Government (MoG) transfers changes during 2002-03 are marked with an asterix. The resource and cash figures for these RfRs have been adjusted to remove the "contra" elements of the MoG transfers (that is the resource and capital elements shown as being outside departmental expenditure limits in the Part II tables). This will ensure that the Supply figures

for the Estimates concerned show more realistic figures for the amounts transferred. Full details of the amounts transferred between departments in these cases are shown in the relevant Supplementary Estimate booklets (*HC 43* for the winter changes and *HC 424* for the spring changes).

### **Administration costs limits**

Provisional outturn in 2002-03 for gross controlled running costs was £17.503 billion – £496 million (2.75 per cent) lower than final limits. **Table 4** shows outturn, original and final administration costs limits for gross controlled administration costs areas. There were three breaches. **Table 5** shows outturn, original and final administration costs limits for net controlled areas. There were two breaches.

### **Breaches**

Whenever a breach of an individual DEL or administration costs limit occurs, the usual corrective procedures will be applied, including an investigation into the causes of the breach, an examination of the financial procedures of the department or body concerned and, where appropriate, a reduction in the corresponding limit in the following year.

### **End Year Flexibility**

The DEL EYF scheme enables departments to carry forward all of their unspent DEL with no upper limit. Eligible amounts are based on unspent DEL less, where appropriate, DEL Reserve claims plus any EYF entitlements from previous years not taken up. **Table 6** shows the amounts for carry forward into 2003-04 for each individual DEL. Subject to Parliamentary approval of any necessary Supplementary Estimates, individual DELs or administration costs limits will be increased when carry forward is taken up.
