Local Justice Reinvestment pilots:
demand on the Criminal Justice System,
year 2

28 November 2013

Background

The Local Justice Reinvestment pilots began in July 2011, and ran until June 2013. Six local areas are participating: Croydon, Hackney, Lambeth, Lewisham, Southwark and Greater Manchester. The aim was to give participating local areas a financial incentive to reduce the overall demand on the Criminal Justice System in the pilot area by working together more effectively at the local level.

Demand was measured using an agreed set of metrics together with an agreed price for each metric. The metrics were multiplied by the price list to give the overall measure of demand.

Demand was measured annually for each of the two years of the pilots and then compared with the baseline year¹ to establish whether it had fallen or risen. If it fell beyond a specified threshold then the area receives a payment equal to a proportion of the reduction. Demand was measured separately for adult² and youth³ offenders.

The local area demand metrics that relate to adult offenders were:

- Total number of court convictions resulting in custodial sentences of less than 12 months (“Custody convictions”);
- Total months sentenced in aggregate for all offenders who receive custodial sentences shorter than 12 months (“Custody months”);
- Total number of convictions resulting in a court order, i.e. community orders and suspended sentence orders (“Court order convictions”);
- Total number of requirements given to all offenders, by each requirement type (accredited programme, unpaid work, drug treatment, supervision, specified activity, mental health, alcohol treatment, residence, curfew, exclusion, prohibited activity, and attendance centre), and;
- Total number of other non-custody and non-court order convictions given at magistrates’ courts (“Other convictions”), excluding convictions for TV licence evasion.

The local area demand metrics that relate to youth offenders were:

- Total number of court convictions resulting in custodial sentences shorter than 2 years (“Custody convictions”);
- Total months sentenced in aggregate for all offenders who receive custodial sentences shorter than 2 years;
- Total number of convictions resulting in a community order (“Court order convictions”)

³ Those offenders who are younger than 18 at the time of conviction

- Total number of other non-custody and non-court order convictions given at magistrates courts (Other convictions) excluding convictions for TV licence evasion.

Hackney only participated in relation to adult offenders; all other areas participated in relation to both adult and youth offenders.

This statistical release presents the demand metrics data for year 2 of the pilots (1st July 2012 – 30th June 2013) and for the baseline year (1st July 2010 – 30th June 2011) for each of the six participating local areas. The demand metrics for year 1 of the pilots were published in autumn 2012 and can be found at the following link.

Data sources and quality

The data presented in this publication are drawn from administrative IT systems. Although care is taken when processing and analysing the returns, the information collected is subject to the inaccuracies inherent in any large scale recording system. While the figures shown have been checked as far as practicable, they should be regarded as approximate and not necessarily accurate to the last whole number shown in the tables. The status of these data when used to produce metrics for the Local Justice Reinvestment pilots is that of provisional management information and these figures may therefore change before appearing in other Official Statistics publications.

Data on custodial convictions, community orders, suspended sentence orders and custody months have been taken from the Ministry of Justice's extract from the Police National Computer (PNC), the operational database used by all police forces in England and Wales. The PNC covers 'recordable' offences, which are defined as offences that can attract a custodial sentence plus some additional offences defined in legislation. Some non-recordable offences are also included on the PNC, particularly when they accompany recordable offences in the same case. A range of less serious summary offences, such as TV licence evasion and many motoring offences are not recorded on the PNC.

Data on other convictions measured for the Local Justice Reinvestment pilot come from the administrative data systems used in the magistrates' courts, Libra Management Information System and data collected by the courts. This is matched against data provisionally published as part of the Criminal Justice Statistics quarterly bulletin.

Data on probation requirements (except curfews) is sourced from the Probation Case Management Systems. Data on individual offenders starting probation supervision, including court orders and the requirements made under them, are collected monthly from the case management systems of individual probation trusts and held centrally by Ministry of Justice.

Data on curfews are provided by the contractors who monitor curfew compliance through the use of electronic tagging.
