Action: Republic of Malawi: ratification

Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons (Abuja, 9 January 2013) has been published as Country Series Nigeria No.1 (2014) Cm 8791. The Agreement is not yet in force.

Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Belgium, concerning Immigration Controls on Rail Traffic between Belgium and the United Kingdom using the Channel Fixed Link (London, 3 December 2013 and Brussels, 18 December 2013) has been published as Country Series Belgium No.1 (2014) Cm 8807. The Agreement is not yet in force.

Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Albania for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with respect to Taxes on Income and on Capital (Tirana, 26 March 2013) has been published as Treaty Series No.3 (2014) Cm 8785. The Agreement entered into force on 30 December 2013.

Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam to amend the Arrangement between the Government of Brunei and His Majesty's Government for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income made in 1950, as amended by an Arrangement in 1968 and a Supplementary Arrangement in 1973, with Protocol (London, 11 December 2012) has been published as Treaty Series No.4 (2014) Cm 8788. The Agreement entered into force on 19 December 2013.

Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the United States of America for the Sharing of Visa, Immigration, and Nationality Information (Queenstown, 18 April 2013) has been published as Treaty Series No.6 (2014) Cm 8790. The Agreement entered into force on 8 November 2013.

Protocol amending the Convention between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of India for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income and Capital Gains (London, 30 October 2013) has been published as Treaty Series No.7 (2014) Cm 8793. The Protocol entered into force on 27 December 2013.

Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of the Philippines concerning Air Services (Manila, 11 December 2012) has been published as Treaty Series No.8 (2014) Cm 8795. The Agreement entered into force on 7 December 2013.

Protocol of 2002 to the Athens Convention relating to the Carriage of Passengers and their Luggage by Sea, 1974 (London, 1 November 2002) [PAL PROT 2002]

Action: ratification and reservation

Athens Convention relating to the Carriage of Passengers and their Luggage by Sea, 1974 (opened for signature at Athens, 13 December 1974 to 31 December 1975) [PAL 1974]

Action: denunciation

Protocol to the Athens Convention relating to the Carriage of Passengers and their Luggage by Sea, 1974 (London, 19 November 1976) [PAL PROT 1976]

Action: denunciation

On 21 January 2014, the Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organization (IMO), as depositary, received an instrument from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland stating that PAL PROT 2002 will enter into force for the UK on 23 April 2014 (in accordance with Article 20(2)) and the denunciations by the same of PAL 1974 and PAL PROT 1976 also taking effect on that date (in accordance with Article 17.5 of PAL PROT 2002).

The reservation to PAL PROT 2002 reads as follows:

"Limitation of liability of carriers, etc.

1. The Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to limit liability under paragraph 1 or 2 of article 3 of the Convention, if any, in respect of death of or personal injury to a passenger caused by any of the risks referred to in paragraph 2.2 of the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention to the lower of the following amounts:

- 250,000 units of account in respect of each passenger on each distinct occasion, or
- 340 million units of account overall per ship on each distinct occasion.
- 2. Furthermore, the Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to apply the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention, paragraphs 2.1.1 and 2.2.2 *mutatis mutandis*, to such liabilities.
- 3. The liability of the performing carrier pursuant to article 4 of the Convention, the liability of the servants and agents of the carrier or the performing carrier pursuant to article 11 of the Convention and the limit of the aggregate of the amounts recoverable pursuant to article 12 of the Convention shall be limited in the same way.
- 4. The reservation and undertaking in paragraph 1 will apply regardless of the basis of liability under paragraph 1 or 2 of article 3 and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in article 4 or 7 of the Convention; but this reservation and undertaking do not affect the operation of articles 10 and 13.

Compulsory insurance and limitation of liability of insurers

- 5. The Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to limit the requirement under paragraph 1 of article 4bis to maintain insurance or other financial security for death or personal injury to a passenger caused by any of the risks referred to in paragraph 2.2 of the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention to the lower of the following amounts:
- 250,000 units of account in respect of each passenger on each distinct occasion, or
- 340 million units of account overall per ship on each distinct occasion.
- 6. The Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to limit the liability of the insurer or other person providing financial security under paragraph 10 of article 4bis, for death or personal injury to a passenger caused by any of the risks referred to in paragraph 2.2 of the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention, to a maximum limit of the amount of insurance or other financial security which the carrier is required to maintain under paragraph 5 of this reservation.
- 7. The Government of the United Kingdom also reserves the right to and undertakes to apply the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention including the application of the clauses referred to in paragraphs 2.1 and 2.2 in the Guidelines in all compulsory insurance under the Convention.
- 8. The Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to exempt the provider of insurance or other financial security under paragraph 1 of article 4bis from any liability for which he has not undertaken to be liable.

Certification

9. The Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to issue insurance certificates under paragraph 2 of article 4bis of the Convention so as:

- to reflect the limitations of liability and the requirements for insurance cover referred to in paragraphs 1.2, 1.6, 1.7 and 1.9; and
- to include such other limitations, requirements and exemptions as it finds that the insurance market conditions at the time of the issue of the certificate necessitate.
- 10. The Government of the United Kingdom reserves the right to and undertakes to accept insurance certificates issued by other States Parties issued pursuant to a similar reservation.
- 11. All such limitations, requirements and exemptions will be clearly reflected in the Certificate issued or certified under paragraph 2 of article 4bis of the Convention.

Relationship between this Reservation and the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention

12. The rights retained by this reservation will be exercised with due regard to the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention, or to any amendments thereto, with an aim to ensure uniformity. If a proposal to amend the IMO Guidelines for Implementation of the Athens Convention, including the limits, has been approved by the Legal Committee of the International Maritime Organisation, those amendments will apply as from the time determined by the Committee. This is without prejudice to the rules of international law regarding the right of a state to withdraw or amend its reservation."
