

As an international organization, It is difficult for us to reach a judgment on the role of another international organisation. In terms of concrete actions, we can only underline our contribution to the on-going Peer Review of the implementation of the Hyogo Framework for Action in the UK that we have organized in partnership with the European Commission and the UNISDR, and the good partnership that we have established with them.

We also truly appreciate the active role of the UK in the OECD High-Level Risk Forum (HLRF). The HLRF was launched in 2011 to provide policymakers and senior executives in the public and private sectors with a collaborative platform to improve preparation for large scale shocks to the economy and society. In this Forum policymakers are refining their vision of what integrated risk management means based on the latest experiences, and shifts in society and technology. The OECD provides members of the Forum with cross-country analysis of risk management policies and practices, country specific in-depth peer reviews (e.g. on Japan, Italy, France and Mexico) and thematic research (Report on Future Global Shocks (2011), G20/OECD Methodological Framework for Disaster Risk Assessment and Risk Financing (2012)) . It aims at developing OECD Principles for country risk management by 2014.

An example of HLRF's recent work for which working together with the UK CCS was instrumental is the G20/OECD Methodological Framework for Disaster Risk Assessment and Risk Financing, launched at the G20 meeting of Ministers of Finance on November 4<sup>th</sup> 2012 in Mexico City.
