INTRODUCTION

VOTE ON ACCOUNT 1982-83

(CLASSES II-XVIII: CIVIL)

The Vote on Account of civil votes (Classes II-XVIII) for 1982-83 is presented in terms of standard proportions of the amounts voted so far for the corresponding services in the year 1981-82 except where it is known that any particular amounts will differ significantly from this standard provision.

The Vote on Account of defence votes (Class I) is separately presented (HC 42) on the same basis as for the civil votes.

The purpose of these Votes on Account, as in the past, is to allow existing services to continue pending Parliament's consideration of the 1982-83 votes for these services. By "existing services" is meant services for which Parliament has voted provision before 31 March 1982, but provision may also be made in respect of a service for which Parliament has passed specific legislation or in respect of a service for which specific legislation is at present before Parliament.

Since the original and revised votes for 1981–82 (HC 190 of 10 March 1981, HC 266 of 9 April 1981 and HC 381 of 3 July 1981) were presented, there have been some changes in their structure. The figures for 1981–82 and 1982–83 in this Vote on Account reflect the redistribution of provision consequent upon these changes. In some cases vote titles have been amplified to show the department accounting for the vote.
