The online transparency and tougher controls have helped cut expenditure on 'Central Departments' Government Procurement Cards' by 91% from \pounds 321,076 in 2009-10, to just \pounds 27,860 in 2012-13 and cut the number of card holders from 210 in May 2010 to just 25 in March 2013.

Whilst there is a role for electronic payments using such cards, under this Administration, the department has introduced new internal checks and audit trails on the use of the Government Procurement Card, from pre-approvals to requiring post-transaction reporting. Our transparency agenda of publishing spending data online has also increased internal and external scrutiny of every single transaction on such charge cards.
