Background

The following statistics, derived from the Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings (ASHE), highlight pension participation in Great Britain for the group eligible for automatic enrolment. These are employees who usually work in Great Britain, are not already in a qualifying pension arrangement, are aged 22 or over but under State Pension age, and earn more than the qualifying earnings threshold for that year.

These are broken down by region, and restricted to the private sector only.

Results

These results highlight the overall declining trend of pension participation, as seen in other sources such as the Family Resources Survey (FRS), the General Lifestyle Survey and the Occupational Pension Schemes Survey (OPSS).

Scotland, London and the South East have consistently had the highest pension participation across the regions, despite the GB wide decline. In 2011, all regions were at 45 per cent, which favourably compares to the overall GB figure of 42 per cent.

The North West, North East, Yorkshire & Humber and West Midlands however, have consistently lower participation, with all regions currently at a level of 39 per cent.
